Sports Complex Wayfinding Signage Project

We are working with Geograph Industries, the new park signs manufacturer, on designing wayfinding signage for the Sports Complex. The current wood signs are original to the park, over 30 years old, so a fresh new look is desired. We are anticipating the new signs will mimic the new park signs, just a smaller version. We will be sure to share the proposed design in the coming weeks.

Robinette Park Renovation Project

We continue to work with the playground company to get a firm date for the installation of the new playground unit at Robinette Park. We are anticipating an early April arrival of the installers and an early May opening of the playground. We plan to conduct a ribbon cutting and will provide the Parks & Recreation Advisory Board a date and time as soon as we have more information.

Art Park Amphitheater Project

This project is currently wrapping up, with some asphalt work as the only remaining task that needs completed. The Contractor is waiting for the asphalt plants to open in order to complete this portion of the project. A ribbon cutting ceremony is being planned for Thursday, May 22, the evening of the first musical performance of the season. PARKS

- Baseball / softball preparations are underway. Spring soccer fields have been set, marked, and are in use. Baseball field #8 backstop, sideline, and dugout fence replacement are nearing completion.
- Cassel Hills Pool seasonal preparations have begun. Repainting of the swim lane targets is being completed.
- CPR/AED/First Aid certification training was attended by all Parks Staff. Thanks to Alicia for including our Staff in this opportunity.
- Installed the practice net at the Golf Course.
- Changing out of some of the metal signs at Helke Park. The new signs have the city blue as the background color. Thanks to Public Works for making these signs.
- The contractor is on site at the Recreation Center. They will be working on several exterior building maintenance tasks this spring starting with expansion joint and mortar joint maintenance on the east side of the center wall.
- Seven AED units were placed back in their locations throughout the Parks. Cold weather had put them in alarm, and we stored them in our Parks Garage through the cold months.
- We will be concentrating efforts at Poplar Hill Cemetery regarding the regulations pertaining to the upkeep of
 cemetery markers. After April 1, we will begin removing items that affect our ability to maintain the cemetery
 grounds in an efficient and safe manner for all visiting the cemetery grounds. Anything removed by our Staff will
 be brought to the Parks Garage, which can be retrieved, if desired.

TREE CITY USA / URBAN FOREST

• Stump and soil work is complete for the next phase of tree replacement on National Road. Once the trees are dug at the nursery, the installation will take place.



Large stumps at two tree wells required the use of a stump grinder for a portion of the removal. Parks and Public Works Staff and shared equipment, along with the rental of a stump grinder, were needed in the preparation for the new trees.

- Applied preemergent to several areas that see the quickest warm up of soil temperatures. These areas included the
 pavers along National and Dixie, the Brown School landscape bed, and the 12 medians. Fertilizer was also applied
 over the plant material in these areas.
- Drilled and placed Manganese fertilizer stakes on the dripline of six Red Maple trees at the Sports Complex.
- Tilled the Community Gardens, placed identification stakes, and brought the compost pile to the Parks Garage compost area. Gardens are ready for use.
- Aerification of turf areas not completed last fall with our small unit is being completed as ground conditions permit.
- Pruning of selected trees for low limbs and water sprouts, including 20 ornamental pear trees at the Sports Complex.
- Placed the Spring tree order from our local nursery. We will be planting 11 total trees: 10 Commemorative, and 1 for the Arbor Day event. Trees are Wright Brothers Sugar Maple, 'Rogers' Lustre Serviceberry, Texas Red Oak, Early Glow Ohio Buckeye, Green Mountain Sugar Maple, and Crimson Sunset Maple.
