He was taken down by a handful of officials who refused to be bought. Remus returned from serving three years in prison in 1927 and gunned down his turncoat wife. He defended himself in court and secured an acquittal that stunned the nation. 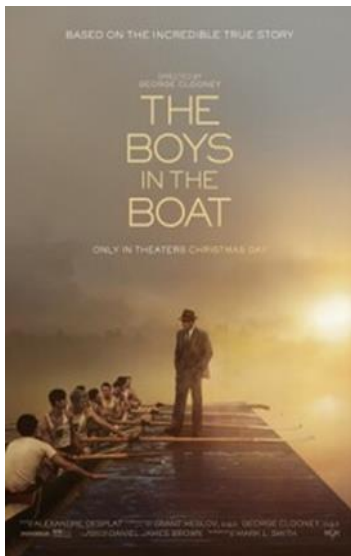
Movie on the First Friday, July 5, at 1:00 p.m.

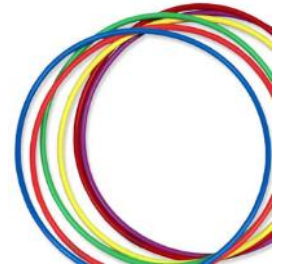


FREE Golden Qi Class on Tuesdays at 10:00 to 10:45 a.m.

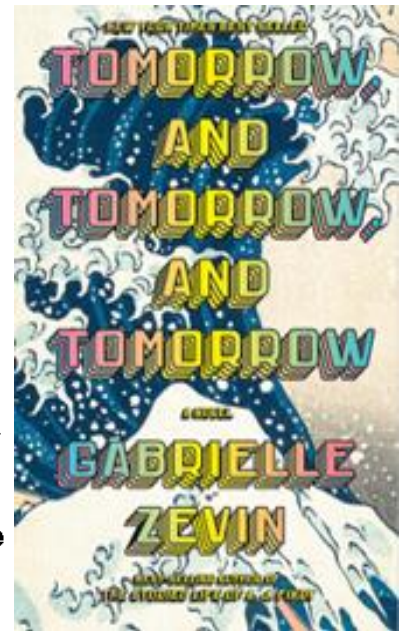
Tech Talk on the First & Third Thurs., July 18, at 11:00 a.m. to Noon
