Battlefield in Montana. Come hear about his adventures. Limit: 80

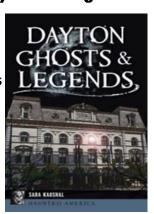
Hearth & Home of Vandalia Lunch & Learn on Tuesday, October 8, at Noon

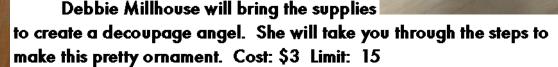

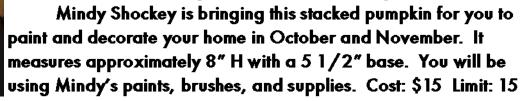
Candy Jones will bring a variety of inks, stamps, craft paste, and stencils for you to

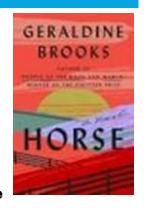

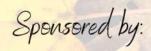
