School Reconfiguration Comes With Benefits

As students and teachers enjoy summer break, crews at Vandalia-Butler City School District are busy working on a major reconfiguration of several schools.

A most notable change will be the shift in grade-level configurations that will start this fall:

- Smith Middle School will become Smith Intermediate School and house grades three through five.
- Demmitt Elementary will be home to first and second grades.
- Helke Elementary will become Helke Early Learning Center to reflect the new grade levels of kindergarten and preschool.
 With this configuration, Vandalia-Butler will provide a full-day kindergarten program for the first time ever.

The reconfiguration does more than help the district save operating costs: It also increases efficiency with building and staff operations, aligns grade-level bands and opens the space needed for a full-day kindergarten program, a community priority for many years.

District's Financial Forecast Improves

The Vandalia-Butler City School District has implemented cost-cutting measures that have resulted in savings of \$3.2 million. These measures include the reconfiguration of preschool through fifth grade and a new Labor-Day-to-Memorial-Day school year.

With these measures and the new revenue-sharing agreement reached between the District and the City of Vandalia, the updated financial forecast has greatly improved. As a result, the Board of Education anticipates it will not seek operating funds with a new levy request for the next couple of years.









City 'Showpiece' Receives Makeover

Fans of Vandalia's summer concerts and events, get ready to be wowed. Major upgrades are in store for the performance area of the Art Park, including the installation of a bandshell covering, expanded seating and a new stage.

"The Art Park has evolved to become a showpiece amenity for the City," said Director of Parks and Recreation Steve Clark

The \$490,500 project is funded primarily through a \$300,000 Ohio Capital Budget bill grant.

"We appreciate the support this project received from our local lawmakers," said Assistant City Manager Rob Cron. "We received help from state representatives Phil Plummer and Rodney Creech, as well as state senators Stephen Huffman and Niraj Antani."

Construction will begin by early fall and be completed this year.

The Art Park is located at 256 E. Alkaline Springs Rd.

City Connects Bike Path to Statewide Network

Construction will begin later this year on a project that will make it easier for Vandalia residents to access the Great Miami River Bicycle Trail.

"When this project is complete, bicyclists will be able to ride their bike from any Vandalia neighborhood directly to the trail on safe, bicycle-designated paths," said Vandalia Assistant City Manager Rob Cron.

The Great Miami River Trail, part of a statewide trail network, begins north of

Piqua and ends just outside of Fairfield in Butler County. It rolls through Vandalia by way of the Taylorsville MetroPark.

The \$4.3 million project will be funded by a \$2.3 million grant from the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission. The City of Vandalia and Five Rivers MetroParks will pay the remainder. The Ohio Department of Transportation is managing the project.

Construction is underway and will be completed by next summer.

The Purple Heart medal is a prestigious decoration awarded to military members who have been wounded or killed in combat. Established by General George Washington in 1782, it is the oldest military award still presented to U.S. military personnel.

Purple Heart City downtown banners and signs throughout the city will showcase this honor.

"We hope they'll serve as a reminder for all of us to thank service members for their sacrifice," said Communication Manager Rich Hopkins.

Improvements Underway for Busy Township Roadway

Improvements to Miller Lane in Benchwood Station have begun and will be implemented in five phases. Completion is slated for no later than early 2025. The anticipated construction schedule below is subject to change based on weather and other factors:

Phase I: Full-depth pavement repairs on Miller Lane will continue through July. Traffic will be maintained. Bus pads in current bus stop locations, pedestrian crossing islands and driveway replacements are also being installed.

Phase II: Full-depth pavement repairs at the Miller-Benchwood intersection will take place in late July.

Phase III: Construction of the new roundabout at the Maxton Road-Miller Lane intersection will take place from August through October.

Phase IV: Pavement widening on Benchwood and traffic signal installation at the Benchwood-Miller intersection will take place by early November. **Phase V**: Asphalt milling and the final course of asphalt, sidewalk installation, landscaping, seeding and mulch and mailbox installation will be the final phase.

The Montgomery County Transportation Improvement District (MCTID) is the project manager.

"We are all in frequent communication and addressing issues as they come up," said Township Administrator Erika Vogel.
