Vandalia Fall Festival: New Venue, More Fun

Clear your calendar for October 12! The City's popular Fall Festival promises to be even more fun and user friendly this year with a move to the Vandalia Sports Complex.

"As the Fall Festival has become more popular, parking has become a bit of a challenge," said Facility Manager Aaron Messenger. "We'll now be able to better accommodate parking for both visitors and vendors."

The festival's lineup has been supercharged, too. A S'mores Station will be available from 2-4 p.m. for those who want to create the traditional treat. In addition to multiple food trucks, a pumpkin patch, inflatable play areas and a corn pit, hay rides will be offered throughout the day.

The Vandalia Fall Festival is Saturday, October 12, from noon to 6 p.m. at the Vandalia Sports Complex, 1111 Stonequarry Road. Admission is free.









Vandalia City Manager Search Underway

The City of Vandalia has contracted with a regional organization to assist in the recruitment of a new city manager. In August, Council entered into an agreement with Management Advisory Group, headquartered in Westerville, Ohio, to lead the process.

While the recruitment process is underway, retired Kettering city manager Mark Schwieterman is serving as interim city manager.

The recruitment process is expected to wrap up by the end of the year.



EV Chargers: City Responds to Citizens' Requests

In response to the growing popularity of electric vehicles, the City of Vandalia has installed 16 electric-vehicle chargers for public use at these City facilities:

Vandalia Municipal Building
Cassel Hills Golf Course
Vandalia Senior Citizens Center
Vandalia Justice Center Public Lot
Vandalia Sports Complex
Vandalia Recreation Center

Thanks to an AES Ohio rebate program, the City is being reimbursed for 100% of the estimated \$320,000 in project costs.

Users will access the units through a phone or tablet app. The charging fee has not yet been set, but it is expected to be comparable to rates around the region.

"This is a service many residents have told us they'd like to see," said Assistant City Manager Rob Cron. "We're happy to provide this program with no start-up costs to taxpayers."



Roundabout Coming to Miller Lane

Construction of a roundabout at the intersection of Maxton Road and Millier Lane is nearly complete.

Although a detour has been in place, officials made sure all business access drives have remained open.

Next up is pavement widening on Benchwood Road and the installation of new traffic signals at the Benchwood-Miller intersection. The last phase will include everything from a final course of asphalt to sidewalk connections, streetlights and landscaping.

Township staff, steering committee members and consultants have been conducting research and inviting residents' input to help develop an updated comprehensive land use plan for Butler Township.

In August, the Township released the second of two online citizen surveys to gain citizen feedback. The survey is accessible on the Township's website. In

addition, an informational open house will be held Thursday, September 19, from 5 – 7:30 p.m., at the Township Meeting Hall. 3780 Little York Rd.

Over the coming weeks, the plan will be drafted, reviewed and refined to create a blueprint for the Township's future. The goal is for the Township trustees to adopt the plan by the end of 2024.



Township Residents to Vote on Limited Home Rule

Butler Township Trustees are asking Township voters this November to decide whether to become a Limited Home Rule (LHR) township. Miami Township, Washington Township and 30 other Ohio townships have implemented LHR.

Butler Township currently has only those powers granted by state law, which greatly limits the flexibility to address the concerns of residents and businesses.

An LHR township has broader authority to regulate the health, safety and welfare of its citizens through the township's police. Township trustees could pass resolutions to efficiently and promptly enforce sanitary, public health and other nuisances, as long as those regulations do not conflict with the laws of the state of Ohio.

However, the Township could **NOT** regulate hunting or firearms, impose new taxes without voter approval; modify

township government structure; create new criminal offenses or impose criminal penalties; or revise building codes, among other restrictions.

If approved by voters, LHR will be initiated on January 1, 2025.

District Saves \$3.2M With Reconfiguration

Students were welcomed back to school on Tuesday, September 3. Much work was completed in the district to prepare for a new Labor Day to Memorial Day school calendar, and also for new grade-level configurations. Both changes were set into motion as part of a cost-savings plan.

This school year, preschool and an all-day kindergarten program are being offered at the newly renamed Helke Early Learning Center. Demmitt is home to first and second grades, and Smith Intermediate School, also newly renamed, is home to grades three through five. An eight-classroom modular unit was installed at Smith to accommodate the addition of third grade.

These changes have saved the district \$3.2 million. With the savings plan and the revenue sharing agreement reached with the City of Vandalia, the district's financial forecast has improved, alleviating the need to seek operating funds with a new levy request for the next couple of years.

Local Groups Fund Life-Saving Devices

In August, automatic electronic defibrillators (AEDs) were installed at the Vandalia Sports Complex, Helke Park and the Vandalia Art Park.

An AED is a device that sends an electronic signal

to stimulate heartbeat in someone who is unconscious, or in breathing distress, while awaiting emergency services. All AEDs come with easy-to-understand directions, so anyone can use them.



"The new devices are available at all times to provide life-saving intervention quickly," said Parks and Recreation Director Steve Clark.

A number of local organizations

donated funds to purchase and install the devices. "The community thanks Butler United Soccer, the Vandalia Rotary Club, the Vandalia Optimist Club, the Butler Athletic Boosters and Vandalia Pee-Wee Football for making this project possible," said Clark.

Vandalia Fire Division Open House

The Vandalia Division of Fire will be rolling out the red carpet for community members from noon to 2 p.m. on Sunday, October 6. 

Butler Athletes to Compete on 'Level Playing Field'

The Ohio High School
Athletic Association has
expanded its tournament
divisions beginning this
school year to address
divisional enrollment
disparities among school
districts. The impacted
sports include volleyball,
soccer, basketball, softball
and baseball.

Before the expansion, Butler student athletes competed in Division I against much larger schools, some more than three times Butler's size.



Now, Butler volleyball, soccer and basketball will compete in Division III, alongside comparable districts. It's expected that baseball and softball will be assigned to Division III when more divisional alignments are announced later this year.

"Our student athletes and coaches are excited for the opportunity to compete toward the dream goal of state championships on a more level playing field," said Athletic Director Jordan Shumaker.
