History of the Membership Dues

The Senior Club began in 1960 and was run by a committee. In 1961, they began collecting \$2 in dues. In 1963, the dues were \$3. The current building was built in 1978 by the City. The City paid most of the expenses while the Committee decided how to use the dues. The Committee changed the dues to \$5 in 1978, \$7 in 1983, and some time between 1984 and 2011, the dues moved up to \$10. At the end of 2011, no one wanted to be on the decision making committee so a contract was signed with the City for the City to run the Senior Center and collect the dues. The City raised the dues to \$15 and \$20. The 2011 contract required the City to keep the dues the same for 4 years. They have not changed the dues for 15 years. Name one other expense that has not gone up in 15 years!

Reality

The dues collected amount to about \$10,000 each year. That amount pays for the printing and mailing of the newsletter. That's it! The dues don't cover the \$7500 in heating and cooling costs or any other budget expenses. It is time for an increase. If you are a <u>Vandalia resident</u>, your dues are going up \$5. If you are a <u>non-resident</u>, your dues are going up \$10. The fees will increase on <u>February 1</u>. Do not delay in paying your dues.



locals. The 19-day, 220-mile, pilgrimage photo journey follows Andy and his hiking partner along the multiple, and sometimes confusing routes including the Litoral, Coastal, Central, and Spiritual routes. The trek concludes on Spain's western shore at Finisterre whose name literally means "end of the Earth," as the Romans believed it was. 



40th Annual Turkey Shoot on Saturday, November 8, at 10:00 a.m.


