




more than one foot away from the edge of the roadway. The pickup schedule is available at: https://vandaliaohio.org/leaf

The next **Employee Appreciation event** is the Donut Bar in the Justice Center Community Room Wednesday, October 25 from 7:00 a.m. until 9:00 a.m. As always, the City Council is invited to attend.

Commercial Truck Traffic: At the next meeting of the City Council, City Engineer Ben Borton and Service Director Rob Cron will give a presentation on updated commercial vehicle traffic counts at the intersections of National Rd. and the Airport Access Rd. northbound ramp, Airport Access Rd. southbound ramp, Peters Pike, and Dixie Dr. I have enclosed a draft presentation. This measurement was done to capture a reading as the Amazon fulfillment facility in the City of Union went online. The City has taken three time series measurements in the last year using consistent methodology. The results show an average increase in the number of trucks that are heading west from town and that they are using the Airport Access Rd. rather than heading east down National Rd. towards Dixie Drive and I-75 (a positive) and an increase in time between trucks along the corridor east of Peters Pike to Dixie Drive (a positive).



During the past two weeks, VPD officers made 17 traffic stops on commercial motor vehicles for traffic violations. These stops resulted in one traffic citation, 14 written warnings and two verbal warnings while working 16 additional enforcement hours.

Our Dayton International Airport Northeast Logistics Access Project work group continues to work with Carpenter Marty, HUD, and other community partners to build out the Lightner-Dixie-Northwoods ring road around the airport. Buildout continues in the City of Union, City of Dayton, and into Miami County on the north side of the airport. This project is a proactive one in that we are planning for management of increased traffic, before it gets here. This project is meant to direct trucks to the I-75 / Northwoods ramp instead of through our central business district. To date, the City and the Montgomery County Engineer's Office have obtained approximately ~\$3.13 million in state and federal funding for the project.

As we work to mitigate the negative effects of commercial truck traffic, it will be important for us to continue to upgrade infrastructure knowing that our best and most effective solutions will be engineered upgrades and controls to how the roadway is built – rather than signage and enforcement.

The **Miami Valley Planning & Zoning Workshop** is scheduled for Friday, December 1 at Sinclair Community College. The City of Vandalia offers this training opportunity to our volunteers on the Planning Commission and Board of Zoning Appeals so that they are refreshed and equipped with the tools they need.

**Solid Waste Management Grant!** This is the third funding cycle in a row that Director Clark has obtained outside funds through the Montgomery County Environmental Services Solid Waste Management Grant Program! This week, Director Clark informed me that the City will be receiving \$8,138.03 for the purchase of Big Belly trash and recycling receptacles at Robinette Park. These are similar to the ones that were installed in the Art Park and Sports Complex recently.

**Risk Management – Best Practices Meeting:** Thank you to Human Resources Manager Missy Pruszynski for facilitating a meeting between the Miami Valley Risk Management Association and our leadership team to review best practices relating to mitigation. Our team continually works to control loss and to mitigate risk to protect the public's interest and to improve the way we serve.

**Healthcare Open Enrollment:** Mrs. Howard and Mrs. Pruszynski are working with McGohan Brabender to prepare for open enrollment (November 1 through November 15). All employees who are eligible to receive coverage must participate in open enrollment – even if it is to just waive coverage. Mrs. Pruszynski will issue health insurance updates and a short video soon.

Employees will be able to enroll online, and we will have phone-in enrollment appointments for employees.

The holidays are coming – and stress can build. I would encourage any employee who could use some help or advice to contact **EmployeeCare**. This is the City's free and confidential employee assistance program. It is available to you and those living under your roof, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You may contact the EmployeeCare staff confidentially, any time, at 208-6626.

**Rock the Rec Halloween Party** is our next community special event and will take place on Saturday, October 28 from noon to 7pm at the Sports Complex. There will be food trucks, trick-or-treat, live music, hayrides and more.

**Ball Diamond Fencing:** A fence contractor is currently installing new fencing on ball diamond #11 at the Sports Complex. Once completed, all ball diamonds will have new black vinyl coated outfield fencing. Work on field #11 also includes new backstop, dugout and sideline fencing which begins phase two of ball diamond fence replacement with diamonds 9 & 10 scheduled for backstops, dugout and sideline fencing in 2024.

ESG continues with closing out the **Facilities Infrastructure Project**. The roofing contractor is installing the stairs on the Justice Center roof and the HVAC contractor is completing plumbing work associated with the humidification system.

**Morton Middle School Lockdown Drill:** On October 10, Lt. Sucher participated in a lockdown drill at Morton Middle School. Staff and students did a very good job of following guidelines and processes during the event.



**Public Works Facility Programming** and Design Kickoff Meeting: Our team held our kick-off meeting with Chris Weidner of WDC Group for the programing phase of the design of a new Public Works Facility. The Public Works Staff, City Engineer Ben Borton, Chief Building Official Pete Baldauf, Director Cron, and I participated. From the beginning, our goal has been to ask our Public Works team to provide input on how we can design the facility to improve operations. Thank you to the team for your excellent input. This was a very productive and important part of the planning, and a lot of great ideas and suggestions were shared by our staff.

**Golf Irrigation Project:** Golf staff met with Technical Choice to go over the first draft plan of the proposed irrigation system. They are now reviewing the plans and will be making recommendations regarding potential adjustments to the planned layout of the system.

**Golf Course Green Aerification:** Greens were aerified last week with plugs from the greens being used to top dress areas of the course. The greens turned out great and when completed fall rates went into effect. Weather continues to control the amount of play at the course as the numbers dipped considerably over the weekend and early this week but are bouncing back as the weather improves.

**Run, Hide, Fight Training:** On October 17, Officer Sommer presented a Run, Hide, Fight program at the Senior Center. He also discussed fraud protection and other crime prevention tips with the guests.

Clyde / Cyril Reconstruction Project Mobilizing: Milcon Concrete Inc. has notified us that they will begin to mobilize on the Clyde & Cyril street reconstruction project next week. They plan to begin sanitary sewer replacement the week of October 30th. Notices detailing the project were delivered to all residents on the two streets. GIS / Engineering Technician Chad Baughman, City Engineer Ben Borton, and Director Cron performed the survey work this week so they can begin on the sanitary sewer work.

Sidewalk Saw Cutting and ADA Ramps: There are some unspent concrete funds due to favorable bids and value engineering. Director Cron and I plan to direct these funds to perform additional some sidewalk saw cutting to eliminate Americans trip hazards and to better comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act in the areas we have scheduled for next year. In addition, we are also going to issue a change to this year's concrete contractor to install some additional accessible ramps on the roadways we are proposing to resurface with next year's program.

**Municipal Bridge Program Grant Award:** Director Cron received notice last week that we have been awarded and grant through ODOT's Municipal Bridge Program in the amount up to \$1,313,211 for the replacement of the Johnson Station (formerly Cassel Road) bridge that provides access to Unibilt Industries. The project is scheduled for construction in State Fiscal Year 2027.

**Water Meter Installation:** Public Works has replaced all of the meters in where the transponders have failed, and the team continues to schedule and to install replacement meters inside of homes.

- Staff borrowed the Public Works asphalt crack patching trailer to seal the new asphalt pathway joints around the new playground at the Sports Complex as well as filling cracks in some of the perimeter pathway on the west side of the complex.

- 1. During the past two weeks, VPD officers made 17 traffic stops on commercial motor vehicles for traffic violations. These stops resulted in one traffic citation, 14 written warnings and two verbal warnings while working 16 additional enforcement hours.
- 2. Detectives charged a 41-year-old woman from Vandalia with Strangulation. The female suspect placed both hands around the neck of the victim, applied pressure, and squeezed. The victim did not lose consciousness and was threatened with a semi-automatic handgun during the altercation inside the apartment. The known suspect was apprehended and transported to the Montgomery County Jail and booked for strangulation.
- 3. Detectives charged three males from Maryland with felony Counterfeiting and Possession of Criminal Tools after Rite Aid called the department about them trying to pass \$400 in counterfeit \$100 bills to buy gift cards. Road Patrol was able to apprehend all three of the suspects as they fled Rite Aid. The suspects were passing the fraudulent bills in the Springfield and Dayton area. CFS#230038199.
- 4. The application deadline for the open position of PSS was on October 13. There were 22 applicants and approximately 11 will move on to the interview panel.
- 5. On October 9, Chief Althouse and Lt. Sucher attended a Miami Valley Risk Management Association meeting, with city staff, to discuss best practices in the workplace.
- 6. On October 10, Lt. Sucher participated in a lockdown drill at Morton Middle School. Staff and students did a very good job of following guidelines and processes during the event.
- 7. On October 17, Officer Sommer presented a *Run, Hide, Fight* program at the Senior Center. He also discussed fraud protection and other crime prevention tips with the guests.
- 8. On October 17 and 18, Officers Stelzer, Clymer, and Matlock attended a two-day drug interdiction course put on by the Ohio State Highway Patrol.
- 9. On October 18, Lt. Sucher attended the 2024 OVI Task Force Grant Kick-Off and meeting at Ohio Highway Patrol Post 57.
- 10. On October 20, Lt. Sucher and SSM Kanzari attended the Ohio 9-1-1 Program Office presentation on the Next Generation 911 project.

### **Development & Engineering Services**

Milcon Concrete Inc. has notified us that they will begin to mobilize on the Clyde & Cyril street reconstruction project next week. They plan to begin sanitary sewer replacement the week of October 30<sup>th</sup>. Notices detailing the project were delivered to all residents on the two streets. Chad Baughman, Ben Borton and I performed the survey work this week so they can begin on the sanitary sewer work.

We received one more signed easement for the right of way acquisition for the Bikeway Project. To date we have signed documents from six of the eight property owners. One of the outstanding properties is CSX. They are in support of the project but there is a separate process to acquire an aerial easement from them for the bridge over the railroad property. One other property owner has counteroffered our original offer to purchase the easements. We are still in negotiations with them. If an agreement cannot be reached, we will proceed with the legal process to acquire the property through appropriations.

With a couple of our projects coming in under our estimates and budget numbers we are proposing to get a jump and on next year's concrete program again. We have received a proposal to perform some sidewalk saw cutting to eliminate trip hazards in the areas we have scheduled for next year. We are also going to issue a change to this year's concrete contractor to install some additional handicap ramps on the roadways we are proposing to resurface with next year's program.

We received notice last week that we have been awarded and grant through ODOT's Municipal Bridge Program in the amount up to \$1,313,211 for the replacement of the Johnson Station (formerly Cassel Road) bridge that provides access to Unibilt Industries. The project is scheduled for construction in State Fiscal Year 2027.

Ben Borton and I attended the MVRPC Technical Advisory Committee meeting on October 19<sup>th</sup>.

### **Public Works**

We held our Kick-off meeting with Chris Weidner of WDC Group for the programing phase of the design of a new Public Works Facility. The entire Public Works Staff, City Engineer Ben Borton, Chief Building Official Pete Baldauf, You and I also attended the meeting. This was a very productive and important part of the planning, and a lot of great ideas and suggestions were shared by our staff.

We did a refresher training with our crews with our leaf collection equipment. We completed our first round of leaf collection this week. Leaves were light this round so we were able to use just one crew for the first two weeks.

We performed water shut offs for delinquent customer last week. Thre were 64 customers on the delinquent list this month.

New water meter installations continue. We have replaced all of the meters in pits that have failed and continue to install the inside failed meters as they get scheduled. As time permits with other projects we will begin installing all meters that are in pits.

Our crews along with several Parks & Recreation staff member completed the asphalt paving of the path around the new playground equipment at the Sprots Complex.

One of our street light poles was hit and damaged at the corner of National Road and Ranchview Drive. The pole was damaged beyond repair so we will be installing a new pole at that location. The driver was sited, and the damage will be charged to their insurance.

Our crews removed two dead trees in the right of way along Clubhouse Way.

We responded to a water leak on Mulberry Road last Saturday evening. The leak was on the water service to a residence, but it was on the City's portion of the service to repair.

We have responded to 107 OUPS requests for utility locates to date in October.

Our single axle 5yard dump truck that we ordered back in March of 2022 was delivered to K.E Rose for the upfitting of the dump body and snow & ice equipment. We hope to have the truck in service for this winter's snow & ice operations.

We continue our recruiting efforts for Public Works Technicians. We have several vacancies. Our job posting closes next Friday October 27<sup>th</sup>. We will begin interviews immediately after the posting closes.

Ben Borton, Jake Hayslett and I attended the Tri Cities Wastewater Authority Technical Committee Meeting on Wednesday October 11<sup>th</sup>.

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) is pleased to inform you that the S. Cassel Road Bridge Replacement project (SFN 5765145) has been selected for funding in the Municipal Bridge Program. The project selections are contingent upon the availability of future federal funds.

With the Bridge Formula Program funding through the most recent Federal Transportation Bill, off-system bridges must be funded at 100% for construction and construction engineering. Therefore, the program will provide 100% of the eligible costs, up to a maximum of \$1,313,211 in Federal funds through the Municipal Bridge Program, in State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2027. Please note, if contingencies were included in the requested amount, they were removed prior to awarding funds per the program guidance.

All options should be considered during the Project Development Process, not just a partial width build.

Please provide written acceptance of the awarded Municipal Bridge funds by Thursday, November 30, 2023 via email to Nichole.Lawhorn@dot.ohio.gov. If acceptance is not received by this date, the funds will be rescinded and awarded to another project in order to ensure a fully funded program.

Please contact Blake Simpson, in the ODOT District 7 office at (937) 497-6807, to schedule a project scope meeting and to start the process of programming your project. It is very important to establish solid commitment dates for your project. Failure to meet the agreed upon dates could result in funding being withdrawn.






- Truck traffic primarily heading to & trom the West (Union Airpark Blvd)
- Most Eastbound truck tractic (78%) turns onto Airport Access Rd
- Notable differences from previous data:
  - 32 more trucks/day entering Westbound: ~7% increase




#### CONCLUSIONS

- Truck traffic primarily heading to the West
- Notable differences from provious data:
  - Same 32 more trucks/day beading West <u>from ramp</u>: ~11% increase
  - 81 less trucks/day turning right from ramp: ~81% reduction
  - 75 less trucks/aay traveling East towards Peters: ~40% reduction

AVERAGE DAILY TRAFFIC (7AM-7PM)




- Truck traffic to Stonequarry Crossings not balanced this data cycle
  - Twice the number of trucks leaving then entering
- Notable differences from previous data:
  - 17 trucks/day less turn night from Peters Pk (signed prohibition & enforcement): ~71% reduction
  - Average reduction of 22 trucks/day East of Peters Pk traveling each direction on U.S. 40: ~21% reduction


#### CONCLUSIONS

- Truck traffic primarily traveling through (West <-> East)
- Notable differences from previous data:
  - Average reduction of 11 trucks/day traveling each direction on U.S. 40, ~15% reduction
  - Percentage of trucks/all vehicles continues to drop, with Eastbound through downtown now under 1%


# East of Intersection (Downtown)






AVERAGE TIME BETWEEN (7AM-7PM)
