2023-2024 Annual Report/Calendar - The Vandalia-Butler High School Honor Society will once again be distributing the 2023-2024 Annual Report/Calendar to every residence and business on Wednesday, December 20, 2023. Every Annual Report/Calendar will be delivered in shrink-wrap to prevent damage due to exposure to moisture. In recognition of their community service, the City will contribute to the Honor Society's scholarship fund.

Leaf Collection (ends 12/5): Depending on weather, crews will plan to make a few more passes throughout the city to collect leaves.

Leaves must be raked into the street, any leaves on the grass behind the curb will not be picked up. In areas without curbs, leaves must be placed immediately along the edge of the pavement. Resolution: Flock Safety Maintenance Agreement - In 2022, the Vandalia Division of Police entered into an agreement with Flock Safety to install cameras and provide the means for VPD to capture objective evidence and utilize machine learning to create and deliver unbiased investigative leads. Flock Safety has proprietary devices and cloud-based software that has been shown to reduce crime in many cities and neighborhoods., The Division of Police has used the cameras in several investigations to help solve crimes and locate suspects. Due to this proprietary software, I request Council waive the formal bidding process and allow the Division of Police to renew the hardware and software maintenance agreement with Flock Safety in the amount of \$27,500. VPD budgeted \$25,000 for this capital expenditure while evaluating one additional camera. The additional camera has been essential, and I would request that this additional \$2,500 be covered with leftover funds from our 2023 new firearms capital purchase.

Resolution: Land Donation - The owner of 3 parcels of land located at the corner of Park Center Drive and Webster Street approached the City with interest in donating the land to the City at no cost. The three parcels, zoned Office/Industrial Park, total approximately 4.393 +/- acres. Considering the strategic location of these parcels, coupled with their adjacency to existing City-owned properties, I recommend that we actively pursue the acquisition of this land subject to the successful and satisfactory completion of an environmental study and title work.

Resolution: Recreational Marijuana Moratorium - Ohio has recently passed Issue 2: An Act to Control and Regulate Adult Use Cannabis, effective on December 7, 2023, which has legalized the use of cannabis for adults and established the Division of Cannabis Control. The Division of Cannabis Control will be responsible for issuing rules on licensing and regulations of permits for operators of adult use cannabis. The Division has nine months after the effective date of the Act to establish such regulations. As of now, it is unclear how these regulations will affect the City. In order to fully comply with the newly implemented law and determine the best course of action for the City, staff is proposing this moratorium to have time to review the regulations set forth by the Division of Cannabis Control regarding the issuance

of permits and procedures for licensing of adult use cannabis. This will assist the City to create reasonable regulations to protect the health, safety and welfare of the community.

The City of Vandalia remains a drug free workplace.

Ordinance: City-Initiated Zoning Text Amendment - This staff-initiated text amendment proposed amendments to several chapters of the Zoning Code. The proposed amendments clarify several processes within the code, introduce additional definitions, and update language. The Planning Commission reviewed the proposed amendments on November 28, 2023 and recommended their approval by a vote of 5-0.

Ordinance: Ohio House Bill 33 Municipal Income Tax Ordinance Updates - This emergency Ordinance includes HB33 mandated Municipal Income Tax Ordinance changes and amendments to Chapter 884 (sections 884.062, 884.091, 884.094, 884.10).

Monday, December 18, 2023:

Resolution: Dog Leg Road Phase Two Utilities Extension Bid Award - Bids were publicly opened for the Dog Leg Road Water & Sanitary Sewer Extension Phase Two project on Tuesday November 21, 2023. A copy of the bid tabulation sheet for referenced bids is included in the packet. This project will extend water and sanitary sewer to our western corporate border. This not only opens this area up for economic development but also provides safe drinking water to all residents and businesses currently in this area. Ten contractors took out bid packages and eight contractors submitted bids for the project. Bids ranged from \$2,243,684.00 to \$4,410,500.00. Our engineer's estimate for the project was \$3,010,190.00. I recommend awarding the contract for this project to Outdoor Enterprise, LLC as the lowest and best bid at their bid price of \$2,243,684.00. Outdoor Enterprise also completed phase one of the extension.

Discussion Items:

Granicus Renewal – Under \$25k- The city utilizes Granicus software for creating council agendas, distributing agendas to iPads, and recording meeting videos and meeting minutes. The annual software agreement is up for renewal in January at a cost of \$14,063.49. IT Manager Davey recommending the renewal of the Granicus software to ensure the continued smooth functioning of our council meetings and uphold our commitment to transparent and efficient governance.

Boards and Commissions Expirations, Reappointment, Meet and Greet – City Manager Wendt will introduce Kevin Larger, an applicant requesting appointment to the Board of Zoning Appeals. At the December 18th Council Meeting, you will be asked to consider the appointment. At the December 18th Council Meeting, you will be asked to consider the reappointment of current board and commission members whose terms expire December 31, 2023.

Introduction Public Works Technician Nick Davidson – City Manager Wendt will introduce Nick Davidson who began full-time employment November 16, 2023.

Resolutions:

Resolution 23-R-77: Sports Complex Fence - The Parks & Recreation Department solicited proposals for a ball field fence replacement project at the Sports Complex. Four (4) fence companies submitted formal proposals with Quality Lawn, Landscape & Fence, Inc. of Casstown Ohio providing the overall best proposal of \$49,145. The proposal includes replacement of backstop, sideline and dugout fencing on fields #9 & #10 at the Sports Complex with 9-gauge black vinyl coated chain link fence fabric and all necessary equipment, supplies and labor necessary to complete the project.

Resolution 23-R-78: Municipal Building Parking Lot – The Parks & Recreation Department solicited bids for a parking lot maintenance project at the Municipal Building. Four (4) asphalt companies submitted formal bids with Neyra Paving of Cincinnati, Ohio providing the overall lowest and best bid of \$53,242. The proposal includes repairs, milling, paving, crack fill, and painting stripes on the parking lots at the Municipal Building including all necessary equipment, supplies and labor necessary to complete the project. The capital improvement budget has \$59,000 available for this project. The project has a completion date of August 30, 2024.

Resolution 23-R-79: Flock Safety Maintenance Agreement - In 2022, the City entered into an agreement with Flock Safety to install cameras and provide the means for VPD to capture objective evidence and utilize machine learning to create and deliver unbiased investigative leads. Flock Safety has proprietary devices and cloud-based software that has been shown to reduce crime in many cities and neighborhoods. To fully comply with the newly implemented law and determine the best course of action for the City, at the recommendation of the Law Director and Chief of Police, staff is proposing this moratorium to have time to review the regulations set forth by the Division of Cannabis Control regarding the issuance of permits and procedures for licensing of adult use cannabis. This will assist the City to create reasonable regulations to protect the health, safety and welfare of the

community.

Ordinance – First Reading:

Ordinance 23-29: Amending Chapter 208, Purchasing, of the Codified Ordinances of the City Of Vandalia – This ordinance was brought before the City Council for consideration at the spring council retreat on May 15, 2023. It was subsequently brought to a study session in June 2023 and then it was tabled in its first reading in July. The amendments were considered by the City Council during the fall retreat on September 11, 2023. The item was tabled at the November 6, 2023, City Council meeting and presented for discussion in the November 20, 2023 Study Session. As proposed, the amendment would include the following:

- Permit informal bidding for purchases that are less than or equal to \$25,000 while the current threshold is \$10,000.
- Permit informal bidding for purchases after advising the City Council of purchases greater than \$25,000 but less than \$50,000 while the current threshold is the range of \$10,001 \$24,999.
- Permit formal bidding for purchases of \$50,000 or more while the current threshold is equal to or greater than \$25,000.
 - Note: the State of Ohio has increased the formal bidding threshold for statutory municipalities from \$50,000 to greater than or equal to \$75,000 with annual escalators of 3% subject to approval by the Director of Commerce.
- Account for the role of public and private cooperative purchasing programs.
- Reduce the requirement for waiving formal bidding by affirmative vote from five Councilmembers to four Councilmembers.
- Formally legislate, document the practice, and affirm the authority of the city manager to make emergency purchases of more than \$25,000 and less than or equal to \$100,000, without prior notice to Council or being authorized or directed by Council as an emergency measure due to it being necessary, in the opinion of the city manager, to provide for the continued protection of the public peace, health, safety and welfare, and for reasons relating to the good order of the organization and maintaining continuity of operations. This language aligns with the emergency ordinance language that is used in the State of Ohio for emergency legislation.
 - Recent examples of emergency purchases that have been authorized by the city manager include but are not limited to:
 - Purchases in response to the Christmas Day flood of the Justic Center to maintain continuity of services and remediation services to prevent further loss;
 - Rooftop air conditioning units servicing the Police Dispatch Communications Center;
 - Temporary repairs after a sanitary sewer collapse;
 - Purchasing replacement pumps and equipment that would otherwise necessitate a shutdown (and foregone revenues) of the Aquatic Center or Cassel Hills Pool;
 - Emergency repairs to fire apparatus;
 - Emergency roof repairs to prevent water infiltration above the basketball court at the Vandalia Recreation Center.
 - Other potential emergency purchases that we hope we never need but may include and not be limited to:
 - Traditional public emergencies:
 - Emergency roadway or bridge deck repairs;
 - Natural disaster response; and
 - Purchases necessary in response to a mass casualty event; and

- Other unforeseen emergencies.
- This provision is meant to document the current and long-established practice of the city manager making rare emergency purchases and then advising the City Council after the fact.
- This provision is meant to be used rarely and sparingly.
- This provision is not meant to and cannot be used to obviate appropriations, which are the responsibility of the legislative body.
- As the chief executive officer and public safety director of the City of Vandalia, the city manager is able
 to prudently and objectively identify the need for an emergency purchase.
- Establish by ordinance the guidance that the city manager shall advise the Council of emergency purchases exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000).
- Increase the threshold regarding the city manager's discretion of whether to require bid bonds for contracts from \$25,000 to \$50,000.

Ordinance 23-32: Ohio House Bill 33 Municipal Income Tax Ordinance Updates - This emergency Ordinance includes HB33 mandated Municipal Income Tax Ordinance changes and amendments to Chapter 884 (sections 884.062, 884.091, 884.094, 884.10).

Variance BZA 23-14: Perimeter Landscaping – 165 North Dixie Drive (Advantage Plumbing and Drain Solutions) - Enclosed in the packet is a memorandum from Mr. Graham wherein the Applicant, Colby Harris, on behalf of Advantage Plumbing and Drain Solutions has requested a variance to forgo the perimeter landscaping requirement for the property located at 165 North Dixie Drive. The purpose of this request is to have no perimeter landscaping. The Board of Zoning Appeals voted 4-0 to recommend approval.

The next Council meeting is on Monday, December 4, 2023 at 7:00 pm. The meeting will be an in-person meeting in Council Chambers. The meeting is open to Council, staff and the public to attend in-person. The meetings will be accessible for viewing on through Zoom. Anyone wishing to be heard on a topic will need to appear personally at the meeting. The Study Session will begin at 6:00 pm followed by the City Council Meeting at 7:00 pm.

Vandalia City Manager **Recognized as Business Professional**

of the Year

Vandalia City Manager Dan Wendt has been named the 2023 Business Professional of the Year by the Vandalia-Butler



Chamber of Commerce, Wendt received the award at the October 24 Vandalia-Butler Chamber of Commerce Honors Banquet.

"Dan received several nominations from Chamber members who have been impressed with his ability to unite community members and achieve great things," said Nick Kavalauskas, Chamber of Commerce Director. "In the time he's been in Vandalia, he's made quite an impact."

The Business Professional of the Year award is intended to recognize contributions by a business professional in the Vandalia / Butler Township business community. The award each year honors an individual whose service, volunteerism and goodwill have markedly improved the community.

In his tenure, Wendt and his staff have procured more than \$15.5 million in grants, donations, and other external funding for City projects. He has worked with the Vandalia City Council to initiate a downtown market study; to administer a small business relief grant program; to establish the City's Job Creation and Revitalization Program; to abate blight through the demolition of dilapidated properties; and to create non-school tax increment financing districts that are expected to generate more than \$93 million for roads and infrastructure.

Wendt enjoys playing with his three children, hunting, fishing, and home improvement projects. He and his wife, Laura are proud to be residents of Vandalia with tiny Aviators in the school district.

Helke Park Ribbon Cutting Ceremony

Kids of all ages in Vandalia know that playtime is the best time! With two new playgrounds open for business, this might be the best time ever to be a kid!

In September, City officials and residents gathered at Helke Park to cut the ribbon on the first new playground there in 23 years. The playground has many of the features you would expect in a playground, plus a few you may not.

"Our goal from the very beginning was to make this an inviting and inclusive playground where kids of all abilities could play and have fun," said Dan Wendt, Vandalia City Manager. "The first thing we did was assemble of committee comprised or residents and City staff, plus representatives from the Vandalia-Butler School District, the Montgomery County Board of Developmental Disabilities, and the Miami Valley Down Syndrome Association."

The committee considered the types of playground features that would allow as many differently-abled children as possible to be able to use. Some of those features include tactile features, a communication board so that non-verbal children can express themselves, and a soft and forgiving turf surface that is easy for wheelchairs to access.

Wheelchair-accessible picnic tables were also added to the nearby shelter.

In October the ribbon was cut on a new playground at the Vandalia Sports Complex. While the playground is dramatically different from the one at Helke, the accessibility features are the same. The Sports Complex playground also has a communication board and wheelchair-friendly turf. It also has a wheelchair-accessible merry-go-round.

Both units were funded primarily through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) with additional funding from the a Montgomery County Community Development Block Grant. Approximately 21% of the \$750,000 project was paid with local funds.

Parks and Recreation Director Steve Clark said playtime is very important to the developmental needs of children. "Play is not only fun, but it's also an essential part of a child's development and critical for the successful growth of both the brain and the body." He said. "Playgrounds offer a unique opportunity to support a child's cognitive, emotional, physical and social development while disguising it as play."

Plans call for an inclusive new playground unit to open in 2024 at Robinette Park. That project includes the construction of a wheelchair accessible restroom and possibly a splash pad in 2025 or 2026.







Medal of Valor awarded to two Vandalia Police Officers

Two Vandalia Police Officers have been awarded the Medal of Valor for their heroic actions during an apartment fire earlier this year.

On Saturday, May 13, Officers Nelson Clymer and Connor Matlock were dispatched to an apartment building located at 111 Imperial Court on the report of a structure fire. Upon arrival, both officers could see a fire in progress in a ground floor unit. An oxygen tank in the room was burning, with an unresponsive 62-year-old man seated in a chair nearby. Also in the room were two other oxygen tanks.

Officer Matlock immediately entered the room and pulled the resident out of the

building to safety, with Officer Clymer assisting.

Once the resident was a safe distance from the building, Officer Clymer made re-entry into the building to check for anyone else who might have been inside. With heavy smoke building inside the structure, both officers reentered a short time later to check the units upstairs in the building. The two officers made forced entry into two upstairs units to be sure there were no occupants inside.

Vandalia Police Chief Kurt Althouse commended both officers for their actions that evening.

"Both of these officers demonstrated

bravery and courage, putting their own lives at risk by running back into the building to alert others and search the apartment units," Althouse said. "They took immediate action in a lifethreatening situation and their bravery and exceptional service ultimately saved the life of a Vandalia resident who was inside the burning apartment."

To qualify for a Medal of Valor, an officer must be in a stressful situation and take action at great personal risk to render aid or assistance to another.

New Crime Prevention Officer

Officer Rich Sommer has been assigned to the role of Crime Prevention Officer for the Vandalia Division of Police, it has been announced. Sommer takes over for Sgt. Andy Wehner, who was promoted to the position of Sergeant earlier this year.

The Crime Prevention Officer fills a vital role within the Division of Police as an outreach officer responsible for assisting residents of all ages in crime prevention techniques.

In the school system, the Crime Prevention Officer plays a key role in the Passport to Safety program, which focuses on incoming kindergarten students at all Vandalia schools. The Crime prevention Officer is also a regular visitor at Butler High School, where he discusses issues such as drugs and alcohol.

A major program each year is National Night Out, which offers an opportunity for police and citizens to unite against crime. Some of the activities during National Night Out include children's activities, bicycle rodeo and static display of public safety emergency vehicles and equipment.

Sommer has served a number of roles within the Vandalia Division of Police. He has served as a field trainer for new officers, a juvenile detective, a SWAT team member, and a Watch Supervisor.

Many young people know Officer Sommer through his work as a football coach for the Vandalia-Butler Schools. Sommer was a 7th and 8th Grade Coach for 10 years.

"I've been a member of the Vandalia Division of Police for

22 years, and I've seen the important work done by our Crime Prevention Officer," Sommer said. "I'm excited to have the opportunity to impact my community in such a positive way."

Sommer says there are things you can do to reduce your chance of becoming a victim of crime.

"Many of the reports we take are crimes of opportunity," Sommer explained. "They are crimes committed because the opportunity presented itself. Based on reports taken by the Vandalia Division of Police, here are some tips to help you protect what is yours."



- Don't mail personal checks from residential mailboxes.
- In reference to phone and internet scams:
 - If you are not originating the contact, treat it as suspicious.
 - Let unrecognized numbers go to voicemail (if it is important, they will leave a message).
 - Never pay anyone with gift cards.
 - Never wire money from a solicitation.
 - If the caller is pushy, hang up.
 - Never give personal information over the phone or online, unless you initiate the contact and verify who you are sending it to.
 - Law Enforcement will never call you and ask for money.
 - If in doubt, call Vandalia Police at (937) 898-5868. We would rather give guidance than see you as a victim.

Vandalia's Downtown Business Corridor Transformation Progressing

The City of Vandalia continues to make progress in transforming Vandalia's downtown business corridor into a more inviting and vibrant section of town.

The 2020 Vision Vandalia Comprehensive Plan identified a desire by City residents and stakeholders to revamp parts of National Road and Dixie Drive and create a more livable city center with amenities to enhance the quality of life for residents and visitors.

The first major step forward took

place in 2022, when the City created the Job Creation and Revitalization Area #1. This action set the framework to begin allocating funds for land acquisition, abatement, right of way improvements, and direct incentives to assist with strategic transformative development initiatives.

Earlier this year, another major step forward occurred when the City sought assistance from third party expertise to identify the types of businesses and potential revitalization incentives most likely to succeed through a formal market study. Place Dynamics is a consulting firm with experience helping cities create this kind of transformation. In July, the company interviewed city leaders and stakeholders to get a better understanding of the direction this project will take. The results of these interviews will be on the City website later this year.

The next step is to use the findings from this study to leverage available outside funds and conduct a full-fledged Downtown Master Plan to create a road map leading to the changes desired for Vandalia's downtown.

Vandalia Seeks Age-Friendly Community Status

The City of Vandalia is excited to announce that we have been awarded a \$15,000 grant from the DMH-Dayton, Inc. Fund of the Dayton Foundation, on behalf of the MVRPC Institute for Livable and Equitable Communities.

This grant will allow the City to conduct surveys, hold stakeholder meetings, and conduct listening sessions to understand how residents and stakeholders view livability in Vandalia. Our goal is to promote civic engagement and identify areas where we can make strategic investments in

the community. Vandalia will use the grant to move the City towards being an age-friendly community.

An age-friendly community is a place that adapts its services and physical structures to be more inclusive and receptive to the needs of its population to improve their quality of life as they age.

Characteristics of an age-friendly community include supports to: allow residents to stay active connected and engaged; keep neighborhoods safe and close to services and shopping;



ensure residents have the freedom to move around using one's own preferred mode of transport; and access to healthy activities.







Vandalia Takes Stand on Larger Commercial Vehicles

Vandalia Police Chief Kurt Althouse was recently part of a group that travelled to Washington D.C. to speak with lawmakers regarding several federal bills that could bring larger and heavier commercial trucks to our roadways.

Chief Althouse has partnered with a non-profit organization called Coalition Against Bigger Trucks (CABT). The organization was in our nation's capital last month to address federal lawmakers on three bills that would allow commercial trucks to be up to three feet longer, and carry an additional 11,000 pounds in cargo.

"There are a number of concerns with these proposals," Althouse said. "Trucks that are longer and heavier and will have increased inertia travelling down the road and will take longer to stop."

Crashes involving these heavier trucks come with an increase of risk of injury or death.

"Plus, the bigger, heavier vehicles would place more wear and tear on our roads and bridges," Althouse said.

It should also be noted that the three bills under consideration do not come with any federal funding to improve the roadways and bridges that were not built to handle these larger commercial vehicles.

Althouse was part of a group that spoke with the legislative offices of both of Ohio's U.S. Senators and ten Ohio Representatives' offices. All three proposed bills have made it out of committee but have not yet been taken to the floor for a vote.

"I felt like our message was well received," said Althouse. "I believe we have support from our legislators."

The issue of commercial vehicles in Vandalia has been a focal point for a number of years. The City has reduced speed limits, required trucks to stay in the right-hand lane, prohibited trucks from making some turns within town, and stepped-up enforcement of commercial vehicle regulations, conducted traffic counts, performed safety studies, and conducted signal warrant analyses in an effort to make Vandalia roadways safer. A regional effort is underway to build a "ring road" that would run around the Dayton International Airport, to funnel traffic from larger warehouses west of town to 1-75.

"The City takes the concerns of our residents regarding truck traffic very seriously," Althouse said. "This recent trip was another step in making sure that all levels of government understand our commitment to mitigating truck traffic and keeping our local roadways safe."

"We're not anti-truck," Althouse added. "We understand that cargo has to move... it's an essential part of our economy. We just don't think they should be any larger or heavier."





Butler Youth Swim Camp

Butler Youth Swim Camp is a 5-week clinic style camp for children ages 5 - 18. The clinic focuses on building proper technique, safety, and efficiency in the water for all strokes. The participants are divided up into the following groups: Yellow, Purple, Bronze, Silver, and Gold. The Yellow and Purple groups are the most novice and are typically reserved for very young swimmers or those swimmers brand new to the pool. 





Electrical Parts Distribution Center Coming to Vandalia

A Michigan-based company with multiple locations in the region is close to completing a project to open an electrical parts distribution center in Vandalia. Kendall Electric, based in Portage, Michigan, is nearing the completion of a 115,000 square-foot facility at 769 Center Drive.

The \$13.5 million structure will open with 45 full-time positions, and the company has plans to add an addition 15 employees within the first 12 months of operation. The facility is expected to serve as the company's Midwest headquarters.

"This is a very nice development for Vandalia," said Micheal Hammes, City Planner. "Kendall Electric is a great company with a strong reputation in the region."

The company considered a number of potential sites before deciding on Vandalia. The Montgomery County's Economic Development/Government Equity (ED/GE) program gave the company a \$150,000 grant to assist in the project, and the Vandalia Development Corporation awarded the project a \$25,000 grant.

Complex parking lot, where the trees will be ground into a mulch.

"This is a service the City has offered for a number of years, and people appreciate it," said Steve Clark, Director of Parks and Recreation. "The drop-off point is clearly marked, and most people are in and out of the lot in less than a couple of minutes."

The City will be accepting trees through the first two weeks of January.

Trash Collection Fee Increase

Vandalia residents will notice an increase in Rumpke trash collection fees for 2024.

The new per-household rate will increase to \$17 per month effective in January, 2024.

Those who live in apartments with dumpster service will have a new rate of \$14.35 per month.

Residents who wish to utilize the carryout service, in which Rumpke crews will carry your trash and



recycling receptacles from the side of your house and return them when empty, will pay \$17 per month PLUS a one-time annual fee of \$136, payable to the City of Vandalia Development and Engineering Services department.

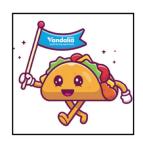




Vandalia is a complex municipal organization. The City organization retains a strong bond rating of Aa2, annual all funds budget of approximately \$61 million, and an average full-time workforce of 275 full-time equivalent employees. The City prides itself on maintaining a strong operating position and ensures that its team of public servants has the tools that it needs to serve the public.

Under the direction of the City Manager, the leadership team executes the policy directives of the Vandalia City Council including the day-to-day operations of police, fire, emergency medical services, and dispatch; water distribution, wastewater collection, and storm water utilities; public works and street construction; economic development, building and zoning, planning, and engineering services; and community enrichment through the Vandalia Recreation Center, Senior Center, Cassel Hills Golf Course, and numerous parks.

In 2020, City Council adopted the <u>Vision Vandalia Comprehensive Plan.</u> There are many exciting anticipated developments in the coming years.

COMMAND STRUCTURE



PUBLIC SERVICE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Public Service is staffed by dedicated and highly trained public servants who provide residents with efficient, honest, and courteous service through the divisions of Public Works and Development and Engineering Services. The department is led by our tenured Director of Public Service, Rob Cron.



PUBLIC WORKS DIVISION

The Public Works Division is responsible for general maintenance of 210 lane miles of roadways; leaf collection; fleet management and the City garage; maintenance, repair and replacement of water mains, sanitary and storm sewers; operation of Poplar Hill Cemetery; ice and snow removal; street sweeping; roadway painting; and sign and signal maintenance. The Public Works team is highly visible to our residents, businesses, and visitors. The City prides itself on ensuring a high level of customer service at every touchpoint with the public.

Full-time employees within the Public Works Division are represented by the Teamsters Local Union No. 957. The Employer and the Union entered into an initial <u>collective bargaining agreement</u> on April 20, 2020. The current collective bargaining agreement expired on December 31, 2021 and is currently under negotiation.

The City of Vandalia is seeking several skilled technicians to join its Public Works team. Vandalia Public Works Technicians perform a variety of duties, as follows:

- Construction, maintenance and repair of streets, curbs and sidewalks, catch basins, manholes, water, sewer, street and storm drainage.
- Operation and maintenance of trucks and power construction and maintenance equipment inspecting, maintaining, loading, and hauling and unloading trash, leaves, gravel, salt, asphalt and concrete.
- Mowing, trimming, plowing snow.
- Miscellaneous tasks: guardrail installation and repair, opening and closing of graves, pick-up and disposal of dead animals, collection of large trash, painting and installation of traffic control markings and devices, and all other duties as assigned.
- Responds to public emergencies and extreme weather events.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Must be at least 18;

Must possess a high school diploma or GED;

Must possess a valid State of Ohio vehicle operator's license, valid Class A Commercial Driver's License with tanker endorsement preferred. Applicants must have a Class A Commercial Driver's License with tanker endorsement within six months as a condition of employment;

Must obtain satisfactory scores on all phases of the qualification process, including oral interviews, practical assessments, background check, physical exam and drug screen.

Demonstrated skill in operating tools and equipment such as tractors, backhoe, loader, paver, grinder, roller, trencher, bucket truck, skid loader, etc.
