Vandalia Bikeway Connector Construction Kickoff: Assistant City Manager Rob Cron and Bicycle Advisory



Committee Chair Chuck Smith represented the City of Vandalia at the Ohio Department of Transportation's construction kickoff event, which featured the Vandalia Bikeway Connector. The \$3.5 million project will utilize a \$2.3 million federal grant. Details include two-way bike lanes on National Road, a dedicated two-way cycle lane on Brown School Road, an off-road paved path along U.S. 40 and Brown School Road, and a bridge over CSX rail lines. The project is expected to be completed by the end of 2025. Mr. Smith shared this article (LINK). The City is working with Five Rivers MetroParks, CSX, the Ohio Department of Transportation, and the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission to achieve this project.

**Resurfacing Stop 8 Rd.:** Barrett Paving Materials has resurfaced a large portion of Stop Eight Rd in conjunction with Montgomery County Engineer Office (MCEO) this past Tuesday (4/16). The City was able to split costs on the portion Webster St to I-75 bridge based on corporation limits. While the contractor was there, the City had Barrett resurface the other side of the I-75 bridge to Miller Ln using Safe & Stable funds.









Our first Brixilated Builders Academy session began on Thursday, April 4 and runs for 4 weeks. We have 12 kids signed up for this session, which is great for a first time, multi-date session. This

League play is underway at Cassel Hills Golf Course. We have a total of 19 leagues this season, playing on various days and times.

Golf maintenance is trying to keep up with mowing of the course as the warm wet weather has created rapid turf growth. The mowing crews are doing an outstanding job keeping the course looking and playing great.

The weather this week has been conducive to golf, so play has been up at Casel Hills. Revenues for Sunday totaled over \$6,000 and in the first four days of the week we totaled over \$17,000 in revenue.

#### **SENIOR CITIZENS CENTER**

Mechanical Systems of Dayton has completed the installation of filters and performed preventative maintenance on the HVAC units at the Senior Center.

Over the years, many members have shared how much the Senior Center has benefited them. Recently, several members told Senior Coordinator Toni Williams the center had saved their lives. They had lost spouses and coming to the center keeps them busy and talking to others. Another member told Toni that she had been depressed for seven years after losing her husband and she didn't have many people to interact with. Since she has been coming, she often lingers after events to have conversations with members she has become friends with during the last year or so. She has been teaching at least one art class each month and says this had given her purpose. She says she is now a happier person because of her involvement at the Senior Center.

The total number of people coming into the Senior Center from April 2 to April 15 was 1055, including evenings and weekends. There were 12 days, including nights and weekends, the facility was rented. The total average was 88 people per day. There were 867 members who came to the center on the 9 days it was open for an average of 96 members per day. The 96 members per day is a high average for the center.

Subject: Information Update Ending April 19, 2024



- 1. During the past week, VPD officers made eight traffic stops on commercial motor vehicles for traffic violations. These stops resulted in one traffic citation, six written warnings and one verbal warning while working eight additional enforcement hours.
- 2. Detectives charged a 45-year-old Dayton man with Forgery after he cashed a fraudulent check at Abbey Credit Union.
- 3. The Division executed its operations plan for the total solar eclipse which occurred on April 8. Our biggest concern was how heavy traffic could affect public safety's ability to respond to emergencies and crimes in progress. We increased our staffing and strategically placed units throughout the City to cut down on response times. With the help of other City departments, we were able to establish back-up plans for communication as well as posting "No Parking" signs to establish emergency routes through the City. After months of planning, we did not experience traffic congestion or any significant traffic delays. While there was heavy traffic on I-70 and I-75, it kept moving sufficiently that motorists did not exit onto City roadways to avoid backups. We were able to release our extra staffing by 6:00 p. m. and returned to normal operations.
- 4. Sworn staff attended annual driver's training during the week of April 8. Officers attended while on duty to demonstrate proficiency on a technical skills course as well as other maneuverability events. This training is provided yearly to all sworn staff and adapted to address any concerns related to the operation of vehicles, tire deflation devices, and the use of push bumpers. All sworn officers are also required to review VPD's Pursuit Policy during the driver's training.
- On April 10, Lieutenants Walker and Sucher hosted a regional leadership meeting at the Justice Center. The group is made up of command staff officers from surrounding jurisdictions who meet to discuss current challenges and share ideas on solutions.
- 6. On April 10, I attended an Executive Board meeting for the Ohio Association of Chiefs of Police in Dublin. Preparations are finalized for the Chiefs Annual In-Service Conference held in Columbus on April 28-30.
- 7. Detectives charged a 48-year-old Trotwood man with Felonious Assault and Felony Domestic Violence after he assaulted his girlfriend while staying at the Knights Inn

- 8. On April 11, I attended an Air Show board meeting at Wright Bros. Aero. This year marks the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the U.S. Air Show and pre-sale tickets are ahead of previous years with many reserved areas sold-out. This year's line-up of performers proves to be a spectacular show. I will be attending a safety and security meeting for the Air Show in the upcoming weeks.
- 9. On April 12, detectives along with investigators of the Ohio Investigative Unit conducted alcohol compliance checks at 14 liquor permit holding establishments in the city. Investigators utilized a 19-year-old female confidential informant (CI) as part of the compliance check. There was only one violation at the Sunoco convenience mart where the clerk checked the CI's valid driver's license and sold her alcohol despite being underage.
- 10. On April 17, Officer Sommer presented *Run Hide Fight* to 100 employees of Sinbon in two sessions.
- 11. I appreciate the opportunity to provide a presentation and update on the Police Division to City Council last Monday evening and share a few exciting events and activities occurring in 2023 at VPD. As mentioned, the Police Division appreciates the support from City leadership as we address community concerns and have seen positive impacts on reducing calls for service at local hotels and continue to dedicate hours on commercial vehicle enforcement and education.
- 12. I attended the City Council and senior staff work retreat on Wednesday evening in the Community Room. I appreciate the opportunity to be involved in the engaging dialogue about what the City has accomplished over the past several years and setting a vision and goals for the future.
- 13. On Friday, VPD participated in a joint law enforcement blitz as part of the Montgomery County Drug Free Coalition with multiple agencies from across the area. This joint operation targeted areas where there are frequent complaints of narcotics and vice activities. VPD participated with one patrol sergeant and one plain clothes investigator.
- 14. April 14-20 is National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week, and we took time this week to recognize and thank all VPD public safety specialists who provide outstanding service to the City and its residents. Our nine Public Safety Specialists work 24/7/365 to answer 911 emergency and non-emergency calls into the Communications Center and dispatch police, fire, and EMS crews to scenes of various incidents. We are proud of our PSS and recognized each one with a daily post on the Division's Facebook page and celebrate the great work they do every day.

#### **Development & Engineering Services (DES)**

The Clyde Place & Cyril Court Reconstruction project is completed. The asphalt roadway, topsoil, and seeding have been completed. Only punch list items remain. Thank you to the Clyde/Cyril and surrounding area residents for being understanding as we undertook this extensive project.

Coate Construction LLC has passed the 50% mark on this year's curb/sidewalk program project with completion of work on Halifax Dr and Mountair Dr. Work will next move to Kenbrook Dr.



Barrett Paving Materials has resurfaced a large portion of Stop Eight Rd in conjunction with Montgomery County Engineer Office (MCEO) this past Tuesday (4/16). The City was able to split costs on the portion Webster St to I-75 bridge based off of the Corporation limit; while the contractor was there, the City had Barrett resurface the other side of the I-75 bridge to Miller Ln using Safe & Stable funds.

Staff met with the owner of 10600 Cassel Rd on April 19<sup>th</sup> to check the status of the 2-month extension on the barn rebuilding.

Staff have been assisting with the new generator work at the Municipal building. When this project is completed, the City building will have a dedicated generator that will automatically turn on to power the building during an outage, allowing the City to continue public services.

Paul Barnett joined our team as a full-time building / electrical inspector on April 15<sup>th</sup>.

I served in the City's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) during the Solar Eclipse event on April 8<sup>th</sup>. Even though the City did not experience the projected extra traffic and associated issues, I still felt this was a good practice of preparation and action for future events when the EOC is needed to be implemented.

Chief Building Official Chris Mastrino and I attended the Montgomery County Land Bank's Brownfield and Demolition Grant Program Discussion on April 9<sup>th</sup>. We learned some valuable information on the Land Bank process and requirements.

I attended the TCA technical committee meeting on April 10th.

Assistant City Manager Rob Cron, Assistant Public Works Superintendent Jake Hayslett, yourself, and I attended multiple meetings last week to discuss the OEPA findings & orders on the NAWA plant.

Staff met to discuss possible condemnation orders on properties around the City and attended the monthly Development meeting on April 15<sup>th</sup>.

Chief Building Official Chris Mastrino, Zoning & Planning Coordinator Ben Graham, and I met with Scott Decker from VBCSD on April 15<sup>th</sup> on some possible improvements at Morton Middle School and what permits/requirements would need to be facilitate this work.

Assistant City Manager Rob Cron, Assistant Public Works Superintendent Jake Hayslett, Chief Building Official Chris Mastrino, IT Manager Darren Davey, yourself, and I met with WDC Group to review the latest programmatic schematic of proposed Public Works facility parcel. We are getting close to finalizing this higher-level schematic to base the design of the facility on.

Assistant City Manager Rob Cron, Communication Manager Rich Hopkins, yourself, and I attended the ODOT Construction Kickoff for the Vandalia Bikeway Connector project at Taylorsville MetroPark on April 18<sup>th</sup>.

Engineering/GIS Technician Chad Baughman attended the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission (MVRPC) Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) meeting for me on April 18<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Public Works (PW)**

Crews continued patching potholes and sweeping streets across the City.

While crews continue exercising water valves (opening and closing) as part of the annual EPA requirement, a nonfunctioning 6" valve (would not close) was found on Stewville Dr and was replaced on April 17<sup>th</sup>.

Some berming was performed on Mulberry Rd near Dixie Dr. This was something brought to our attention by a concerned resident in the area. As we strive to be as proactive as possible, we always appreciate receiving concerns from citizens to help us create a better and safer community.

Crews were staged with equipment and materials as traffic management teams as part of the Incident Action Plan (IAP) for the Solar Eclipse.

We continued trimming brush back in the right-of-way (ROW) around the City using our Trackless MT7 mower.



Crews have been performing sanitary sewer lift station maintenance.

We finished our annual catch basin inspection and will begin repairs on noted issues in the coming weeks.

Crews received training on the new SL-RAT equipment and fall protection on April 19<sup>th</sup>.

We performed 87 utility locates this period for Ohio 811.

Crews performed 2 burials at Poplar Hill cemetery during this period.

We are currently accepting applications until April  $29^{th}$  to fill the vacant full-time Public Works Office Manager position.

Congratulations to Public Works Superintendent Wally Richie on his retirement! His last day in the office was April 19<sup>th</sup>. Wally has been instrumental with numerous improvements in the Public Works Division since his hiring in 2022. We wish Wally the best with his retirement.

With Wally's retirement, congratulations are in order for Assistant Public Works Superintendent Jake Hayslett who has accepted the promotion of Public Works Superintendent, effective April 19<sup>th</sup>. Since 2017, Jake has worked for the City for 4 years as a PW Technician and the last 1.5 years as the Assistant PW Superintendent. He is Vandalia native and graduate of Bulter High School. I look forward to working closely with Jake as we continue to provide top-tier City services to our residents and businesses.

**Subject:** March 2024 Crime Statistical Report Summary

Total calls for service to the Communications Center decreased 4.2% from 1,041 calls in March 2023 to 997 calls in March 2024. There were 877 citizen-initiated calls for service (down .02%), and there were 120 officer-initiated calls (down 26%).

VPD investigated no homicides and robberies and handled one rape investigation during March. There were three assaults and five domestic violence offenses reported in March 2024 compared to five assaults and six domestic violence offenses in March 2023. Domestic violence cases decreased by 17% during March; however, they were up by one incident overall in 2024 when compared to 2023.

There were two burglaries reported in March 2024 compared to only one burglary reported in March 2023. Thus far in 2024, burglaries/breaking & entering increased by one offense, felony thefts decreased 12%, auto thefts are down 22% with seven offenses, while misdemeanor thefts increased by 127%. There were eight criminal damaging/vandalism complaints in March 2024, up from one last March. Criminal damaging and vandalism offenses are up 62.5% compared to last March. VPD officers have focused on being visible in the residential and business areas of the city to display a police presence and prevent crime. Officers made one felony drug arrest in March compared to six misdemeanor drug arrests in March 2023.

VPD had fewer arrests in March 2024 with seven felony arrests and 24 misdemeanor arrests this year compared to 35 arrests last year. The Division also experienced fewer juveniles involved in criminal offenses. VPD officers charged one juvenile with an offense in March 2024, compared to three juveniles in March 2023. These charges have primarily included sex offenses, drug and/or alcohol violations, and thefts.

During March, VPD officers made 333 traffic stops while patrolling Vandalia's roadways, a 21% decrease. These stops resulted in 61 citations, 182 written warnings, 88 verbal warnings, and two stops with other dispositions. Speed citations and other citations are up 5% in 2024, while OVI arrests in 2024 remain unchanged when compared to 2023 with a total of 13 arrests year-to-date. Parking citations decreased from 34 parking citations in March 2023 to six parking citations in 2024.

These parking citations have primarily been on violations of commercial vehicles parked in restricted areas on highway exit ramps. VPD officers investigated 22 traffic crashes in March 2024, the same number investigated in March 2023. Officers will continue to patrol Vandalia's roadways and work traffic enforcement to keep our roadways safe and reduce traffic crashes.

Officers responded to fewer alarm drops than a year ago with a decrease from 70 business and residential alarms in March 2023 to 43 alarms in March 2024. Alarm drops overall for 2024 are down 25.5% YTD compared to 2023.

Overall, 2024 is off to a good start with fewer criminal offenses, a slight increase in arrests, and a decrease in traffic crashes. VPD officers will remain focused on patrol activities and traffic enforcement while addressing community concerns related to these areas to keep our city a great place to live, work, and play.

#### **2024 Full-Time Pay Period Changes**

With the approval of City Manager Wendt, Finance will be permanently changing the pay period dates for full-time and permanent part-time employees to follow a Sunday-Saturday workweek rather than the current Wednesday-Tuesday workweek.

The current workweek has been a confusion to hourly employees throughout the years as it relates to overtime calculations. Making this change will create a more logical workweek for employees to track the number of hours they have worked in the week to avoid overtime. This change will also allow additional time for administrative and managerial staff to review and approve timecards in Executime before it is locked for payroll processing. I believe this is advantageous to employees, supervisors, and payroll.

For this transition, we will need paper timesheets for Pay #12 (Check Date 6/7/2024) and Pay #13 (Check Date 06/21/2024). For both pay periods, employees will be paid for their regular schedule and should see no shortage of pay on their paychecks, only the dates will reflect differently for this transitional pay period.

For Pay #12, a paper timesheet will be completed to reflect hours worked for the old pay period and one to reflect the hours for the new pay period. The timesheet showing the old pay period dates is being used to accurately calculate any overtime pay that is due to the employee, which should be limited to only emergency instances where possible.

For Pay #13, a paper timesheet will be completed to show all hours worked using the new pay period dates. Any overlapping dates that were already paid in Pay #12 will be paid in full again and will be counted toward any overtime calculation for the new pay period dates.

All full-time and permanent part-time employees will resume using Executime for Pay #14, which begins on June 16.

Attached you will find the old pay schedule and the new pay schedule. The dates that employees are paid will not be changed, simply the dates that fall within the pay period.

Any questions or concerns can be directed to the Finance Department, and we will be more than happy to help ease any burden this transition may cause.

#### Statement Regarding the Lawsuit Filed by the Vandalia-Butler School District

The city has been working in good faith with the school district since first advising the school district in October 2022, that unpaid money may be owed to the school district from the city. This dispute is the result of an update to revenue-sharing regulations that went into effect under state law in 1994 but were not implemented by the city and the school district.

The city determined that depending on the applicable statute of limitation, it may owe between two years and six years in back payments.

After self-reporting, the city offered to meet with the school district and to use a mediator to determine a fair solution. In late March 2024, the city believed that it had reached a fair agreement as to the amount due that included the city paying for six years of back payments starting with 2022. The school district requested additional back payments and sums beyond what is required by law going forward. This caused the city to discontinue its negotiations with the school district.

In keeping with what it believes to be its legal obligation, the city passed a resolution on April 1 authorizing the city to make six years of payments totaling \$3,355,750.52 over the next four years plus the statutory payments going forward. The school district accepted payments from the city totaling \$1,350,467.63 representing the two most recent years on April 12, 2024. On April 15, the school district filed a lawsuit.

The city will continue to work towards a fair and equitable solution that is good for the community as a whole and is within the confines of the law.



The 2024 road construction season has arrived.

At an event Thursday at the Taylorsville MetroPark, ODOT held a kickoff event and highlighted a \$3.3 million dollar project with the city of Vandalia and Five Rivers MetroParks. The project will allow bikers and pedestrians safer access between the city and the Great Miami River Trail.

"We strongly believe that this will be a transformational project for our city."

The project is expected to begin construction this summer, and when finished the new bikeway will connect the city of Vandalia to a network of over 350 miles of paved trails.

"I used this trail everyday on my commute back from work at Wright Patterson Air Force Base," said Chuck Smith, chair of the Ohio Bicycle Federation. "I would commute to Vandalia, so I had to carry my bike across the CSX tracks about a mile up the road."

The new path will include a bridge that spans those railroad tracks, connecting the existing bikeway in Vandalia along National Road at Foley Drive to the Great Miami River Trail at Taylorsville MetroPark near Taylorsville Dam.

The project also includes bike lanes on U.S. Route 40 between Foley Drive and Brown School Road and a two-way cycle track on the east side of Brown School Road. from U.S. 40 to Cassel Creek Drive.

Rob Cron, assistant city manager for the city of Vandalia, said this aligns with the city's goal to be a more bicycle friendly community.

"We strongly believe that this will be a transformational project for our city, giving our

trail a way to get into our city and see what we have to offer," Cron said.

#### Safe driving urged as accidents climb

ODOT officials used the event to urge drivers to be more aware when in construction zones.

In the lead up to the event, there had already been 43 accidents involving motorists and construction crews this year.

As officials spoke, that number rose to 44.

"Last year we had 56 hits so as you can see, we are way ahead of last year's schedule. Which is a bad thing. We need everyone's help to keep them safe by putting down the distractions and obeying the speed limits," Bud O'Brien, deputy director of transportation, said.

ODOT is spending \$2.8 billion on road and bridge improvements across the state, with over 220 projects going on in the Southwest region that once complete, will help significantly reduce traffic congestion and improve roadway safety.

- Constructing new ramps at the Kennedy Avenue interchange along I-71 in Hamilton County
- Continued construction of the interchange at U.S. 35 and Valley/Trebein Road in Greene County
- Construction of the Glen Este Withamsville overpass along State Route 32 in Clermont County
- Continued Construction at the interchange of U.S. 35 and Woodman Drive in Montgomery County
- Adding pedestrian safety improvements to State Route 725 between Byers Road and State Route 741 in Montgomery County
- Widening State Route 63 between Union Road at Monroe and State Route 741 in Warren County

### Strategic recommendations

Market conditions dictate that Vandalia will need to take a phased approach to achieving its vision of a pedestrian-oriented downtown district. With few immediate opportunities to attract retail and dining businesses, the initial focus can leverage strong demand for better-quality, market rate apartments and condominiums in multifamily buildings. These can transition to mixed-use buildings on the street frontage. A secondary effort can enhance anchor businesses and buildings expected to remain in a redeveloped corridor. A larger retail and dining recruitment program can be implemented as conditions improve.

#### Strategy

The recommended strategy has three overlapping phases, with the transition between them depending on the pace of development. The intent of each phase is to capture the

market opportunity available at the time, effecting change to bring about the conditions that make it possible to support other uses.

#### Phase one

The initial phase should focus on collaboration with property and business owners, encouraging and facilitating investments in real estate and business enhancement, while beginning to assemble future redevelopment sites in core areas of the downtown.

Redevelopment. There is an immediate demand for market rate apartments, senior housing, and condominiums that can be built at the rear of large lots on Dixie Drive, or on side streets. The City can support this by sharing the market case, and through financial or permitting assistance.
