Honorable Mayor & Esteemed City Councilmembers:

Congratulations to Support Services Manager Anissa Kanzari who retired on October 31st after six years of dedicated service in the Police Division. Ms. Kanzari's duties as Support Services Manager included supervising the functions of the Division's Records and Communications Sections as well as coordinating police fiscal operations. During her tenure, she coordinated and overseen the training and implementation of Spillman Flex Software, a new Computer-Aided Dispatch (CAD) and Records Management System (RMS) for the Police Division in 2018. She coordinated the NexGen911 implementation and text-to-911 feature for the Communications Center. She was instrumental in selecting and implementing Emergency Medical Dispatching (EMD) protocols in the Communications Center to meet state requirements for all Public Safety Answering Points (PSAP). She also became an APCO trainer for EMD.

Proclamation - World Day of Remembrance - Mayor Herbst will present a proclamation to members of the Bicycle Committee proclaiming November 17, 2024, as World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims.

Monday, November 18, 2024, Items:

Resolution: OARnet Purchase Agreement for VMware Software – The IT Department is requesting City Council's approval of a 5-year purchase agreement with OARnet for VMware subscription licensing. VMware, recently acquired by Broadcom, has shifted from perpetual licenses to a subscription model, increasing costs. Although the new agreement is more than double our previous contract, OARnet's discounted rates remain the most cost-effective option. The total cost of the 5-year agreement is \$91,213.44, with the Year 1 payment retroactively covering July 31, 2024, to July 30, 2025. IT Manager Davey is recommending that city council waive formal bidding and approve a 5-year purchase agreement with OARnet for VMware subscription licensing for a total cost of \$91,213.44 to ensure continuity of our virtual infrastructure at the best available rates through OARnet. To cover the additional costs in 2024, IT Manager Davey is recommending a supplemental budget appropriation of \$8,103.64, which will be included in the budget appropriation request by Finance.

Ordinance: Supplemental – Mrs. Leiter will discuss a 2024 supplemental appropriation Ordinance for the following items:

General Fund:

Police - Administration:

• \$400.10 – increase appropriations to account for costs related to a personal charge to a hotel for hotel reservations made in error by an employee on the city purchasing card. The employee reimbursed the city for the expense.

Police - Operations:

- \$8,039 increase appropriations to account for a donation to the Division of Police to apply to the purchase of furniture for an outdoor seating area at the Justice Center.
- (\$17,500) decrease appropriations from the fuel account in the operations department within the
 General Fund to the Police-Fire-Street CIP Fund to purchase an E-bike and camera/audio. Both pieces of
 equipment were originally requested in the 2025 Capital Budget but were removed and the items were
 purchased in 2024.
- \$6,660.48 increase appropriations to account for costs related to repair work on two police vehicles that were recently damaged. The City's insurance provider will reimburse the costs.

Fire:

• \$5,000 – increase appropriations to account for revenue received from the sale of ten (10) used Motorola portable radios to the Harrison Township Fire Department and reimburse the expense account in the General Fund.

 \$100 – increase appropriations to account for costs associated with the purchase of candy to be used at fall 2024 events attended by the Division of Fire. A donation was received from the American Legion Auxiliary Post 668 to cover the costs of the candy.

IT:

• \$8,103.64 – increase appropriations to account for costs related to VMware. The current VMware vendor was purchased by Broadcom and the licensing model changed from perpetual to a subscription. To obtain competitive pricing, the city must commit to a 5-year pricing agreement. The change in cost is significantly higher but is still quite a bit less than retail cost. The city's contract expired at the end of July; therefore, the new price went into effect beginning in August 2024 moving forward. The increase in cost was not included in the 2024 Budget, and part of the cost was offset by unused budgeted funds in other accounts.

Non-departmental:

- \$400,000 increase appropriations to account for the transfer of funds from the General Fund to the
 Capital Improvement Fund. The grant funds received from the State of Ohio were applied to the General
 Fund and will be transferred to the Capital Improvement Fund to be used as an offset for costs
 associated with the Robinette Park Improvements Project.
- \$2,200,000 increase appropriations to account for the transfer of funds from the General Fund to the Golf Fund to offset costs associated with the Golf Course Irrigation System Project.

OMVI E&E Fund:

\$38,529.93 – increase appropriations to account for the transfer of funds from the OMVI E&E Fund to the
OMVI Indigent Fund. An internal audit was conducted, and it was determined that funds were posted to
the OMVI E&E Fund and should have been posted to the OMVI Indigent Fund.

American Rescue Plan Act Fund:

Parks & Recreation – Parks:

(\$296,164) – decrease appropriations in the Parks department and increase appropriations in the Golf
Course Maintenance department. Additional outside funding was received to offset costs related to the
Robinette Park improvements project; therefore, another need for use of the remaining ARPA funds has
been identified and will be used to offset costs associated with the Golf Course Irrigation System Project.

Golf Course – Course Maintenance:

\$297,467 - increase appropriations in the Golf Course department. Additional outside funding was
received to offset costs related to the Robinette Park improvements project; therefore, another need for
use of the remaining ARPA funds has been identified and will be used to offset costs associated with the
Golf Course Irrigation System Project.

FEMA Special Revenue Fund:

\$32,761.17 – increase appropriations to account for the transfer of funds from the FEMA Special
Revenue Fund to the General Fund. The funds received from federal grants (fire prevention and safety
and the 2024 Eclipse event) are required to be posted to the FEMA Special Revenue Fund and
subsequently transferred to the appropriate fund the expenditures were originally expensed from.

Capital Improvement Fund:

Parks & Recreation - Parks:

\$366,000 – increase appropriations to account for costs related to the design services, and due to the
removal of the ARPA funds originally earmarked for the Robinette Park improvements project, which
have now been designated for use on the Golf Irrigation System Project.

Police-Fire-Street CIP Fund:

Street:

(\$717,132) – decrease appropriations to account for the revenue and expense related to the Webster St
resurfacing project. The city received a grant that was used to offset the expense and neither the revenue
nor the expense was required to be processed through the city's finance software system.

Police - Operations:

• \$17,500 - increase appropriations from the fuel account in the operations department within the General Fund to the Police-Fire-Street CIP Fund to purchase an E-bike and camera/audio. Both pieces of equipment were originally requested in the 2025 Capital Budget but were removed and the items were purchased in 2024.

CDBG Fund:

Non-departmental:

(\$50,000) – decrease appropriations to account for an expense transfer from a multiple purpose
department account code included in the CDBG Fund to the sewer department account code to properly
apply the expense to the correct department affiliated with the project.

Sewer:

• \$50,000 - increase appropriations to account for an expense transfer from a multiple purpose department account code included in the CDBG Fund to the sewer department account code to properly apply the expense to the correct department affiliated with the project.

Golf Fund:

Course Maintenance:

- \$30,000 increase appropriations to account for costs related to storm damage to power lines from the wellfield for the irrigation system.
- (\$297,467) decrease appropriations related to costs associated with the Golf Course Irrigation System.
 The remaining funds in the ARPA Fund will be used to offset part of the total cost of the Irrigation System Project.

Ordinance: 2025 Budget and Budget Adjustment Items – This ordinance authorizes appropriations for FY 2025. The City's operating, capital, and revitalization budget is a policy document and fiscal plan that we use to set out anticipated revenue and expenditures for accomplishing a variety of public services over a given time. The 2025 budget is scheduled to be on the November 18, 2024, Council Meeting agenda for a first reading. Pending passage in a first reading, the budget is scheduled for a second reading and adoption on December 2, 2024.

Discussion Items:

Outfront Media Leases – The City acquired what is now Stonequarry from a farmer that had existing billboard leases. The leases original terms expired and are now year to year. It is unlikely that the City will develop land such that the signs will be an issue. Outfront Media has requested that we enter into long-term agreements.

OPEN ENROLLMENT

Open enrollment for the medical, dental and health savings account begins November 4th and runs through November 15th. The effective date for all changes will be January 1, 2024.

ELIGIBILITY INFORMATION

All regular full-time employees working at least 40 hours are eligible to enroll or apply for the benefits listed on the following pages as long as the eligibility requirements are met. If your spouse is employed and their employer offers coverage that is \$100 or less per month, they are *not eligible* for coverage under the City of Vandalia plan. If your spouse's coverage is in excess of \$100/month, a spousal coverage form must be completed by your spouse's HR department and returned to the City of Vandalia's Human Resources department.

MAKING CHANGES DURING THE YEAR

Please remember that the only time enrollment changes can be made outside of open enrollment is in the case of a qualifying event. Examples of qualifying events include but are not limited to: birth, adoption, death, divorce and marriage. It is your responsibility to notify HR of a qualifying event. Enrollment through Employee Navigator must be completed within 30 days of the event.
