RESOLUTION 14-R-72

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING COOPERATION AND CONTRACTS WITH OHIO
DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION REGARDING ODOT PROJECT MOT IR 75 22.73
FOR A NEW TRAFFIC SIGNAL AT THE RAMP INTERSECTION OF INTERSTATE ROUTE 75
NORTHBOUND AND NORTHWOODS BLVD.**

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio has identified the need for a project to install a new traffic signal at the ramp intersection of Interstate Route 75 Northbound and Northwoods Blvd. (County Route 647) to mitigate congestion and improve traffic operation and has identified the project as MOT IR 75 22.73 (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) requires a Resolution, substantially in the form of this Resolution in order for the Project to commence;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
VANDALIA, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, OHIO THAT:**

Section 1. Being in the public interest, the City gives consent to the Director of Transportation to complete Project MOT IR 75 22.73

Section 2. The City shall cooperate with the Director of Transportation in Project MOT IR 75 22.73 as follows:

- a. The City agrees to assume and bear One-Hundred Percent (100%) of the entire cost of the improvement, less the amount of Federal-aid and State funds set aside by the Director of Transportation for the financing of this improvement from funds allocated by the Federal Highway Administration, U.S. Department of Transportation,.
- b. In addition, the City also agrees to assume and bear One-Hundred Percent (100%) of the cost of any construction items requested by the City on the entire improvement, which are not necessary for the improvement, as determined by the State and Federal Highway Administration.
- c. If curb ramps are constructed by ODOT in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act, future maintenance of installed sidewalk curb ramps shall be the responsibility of the City.
- d. The City shall adjust any existing castings, as required, with City Forces.

Section 3. The City agrees that all right-of-way required for the Project will be acquired and/or made available in accordance with current State and Federal regulations. The City also understands that right-of-way costs include eligible utility costs. Further, the City agrees that all utility accommodation, relocation and reimbursement will comply with the current provisions of 23 CFR 645 and the ODOT Utilities Manual.

Section 4. Upon completion of the Project, and unless otherwise agreed, the City shall: provide adequate maintenance for the Project in accordance with all applicable state and federal law, including, but not limited to, Title 23, U.S.C. Section 116; provide ample financial

provisions, as necessary, for such maintenance of the Project; maintain the right-of-way, keeping it free of obstructions; and, hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes.

Section 5. City Manager, Jon Crusey or his designee are hereby empowered on behalf of the City of Vandalia to enter into contracts with the Director of Transportation necessary to complete the Project.

Section 6. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.
