# A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE VANDALIA SENIOR CITIZENS CLUB

**WHEREAS**, the Council of the City of Vandalia has determined that it is in the best interest of the City to enter into an agreement with the Vandalia Senior Citizens Club.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF VANDALIA, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, OHIO THAT:

Section 1. The agreement between the City of Vandalia and the Vandalia Senior Citizens Club, a copy of which is on file in the office of the Clerk of Council, is hereby adopted.

<u>Section 2</u>. Robert L. Anderson, city manager, is hereby authorized to enter and execute this agreement on behalf of the City.

#### AGREEMENT REGARDING SENIOR CENTER

This Agreement is made this _	day of	, 2011 by and between Vandalia
Senior Citizens Club, an Ohio u	inincorporated association	(the "Club") and the City of Vandalia
Ohio (the "City")		

WHEREAS, the Club is an unincorporated association that provides certain benefits to its members and has been operating within the City of Vandalia for several years; and

WHEREAS the Club is not formally affiliated with the City of Vandalia; and

WHEREAS the City of Vandalia has been providing programming and facilities (the "Senior Center") for seniors in the Community for a number of years, most of who are members of the Club:

WHEREAS, the Club has been colleting membership dues for several years, but said dues have not been paid to the City for the programming or facilities provided; and

WHEREAS, the Club desires to cease collecting membership dues for the Club and instead, pay a corresponding fee to the City to be used by the City for such programming, facility costs and administration (the "Senior Center Access Fee"); and

WHEREAS, the Club desires that the City be in charge of collecting the Senior Center Access Fee:

NOW, THEREFORE, the City and Club agree as follows:

- 1. The Club agrees that all seniors that pay the Senior Center Access Fee to the City will be automatically included in the Club and entitled to whatever benefits the Club may provide to its members.
- 2. The City agrees that the Senior Center Access Fee will initially be \$15.00 for single residents; \$25.00 for resident married couples; \$20.00 for non-residents; and \$35.00 for non resident married couples. Resident is defined as someone who lives and/or pays property taxes to the City of Vandalia. The City also agrees to maintain this annual fee structure through 2015. The City agrees that seniors that are 90 years of age and over will not be charged the Senior Center Access Fee. It is understood that the year a senior turns 90 years of age, that senior will no longer be charged the Senior Center Access Fee.
- 3. The City will waive the Senior Center Access Fee for a Club Member that is properly designated by the club to be a "Life Member". A Life Member is voted on by the Senior Citizens board and membership and "is someone who has rendered outstanding or notable services to the Vandalia Senior Citizens Club" (Club Bylaws, 2009.). The Club will not designate more than Two (2) Life Members in any calendar year.
- 4. The City agrees that for so long as the City maintains the Senior Center, individuals paying the Senior Center Access Fee (and those eligible individuals that are granted access to the Senior Center without being required to pay such fee, (seniors 90 and older and Life Members) will be provided free reasonable use of the facilities during open

hours, and after hour events which may include the potluck dinners, catered dinners, annual bazaar and Club fundraisers, the ability to participate in free and/or discounted priced programs, the ability to participate in other programs and services offered by the City and/or others, for seniors at the Senior Center, all in accordance with any rules and regulations of the City that may be imposed from time to time related to such use.

- 5. The City will be solely responsible for publishing and distributing a monthly senior newsletter.
- 6. The City may offer other benefits or services from time to time, which may include, but not be limited to Monday and Wednesday congregate meals, Medicare counseling, and support groups. The City may add or discontinue any programming or service. The City may require seniors using the Senior Center to enter into reasonable use agreements and sign reasonable waivers for certain activities.
- 7. Nothing herein shall be deemed to require the City or Club to maintain any particular program, service or event.
