Section 2. The Director of Finance for the City is authorized to draw warrants on the City Treasury for payments from any of the foregoing appropriations upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers, provided that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except the person employed by authority of and in accordance with

Section 3. The Director of Finance is authorized to make transfers from the General Fund as necessary.

<u>Section 4</u>. In the event that bids for contractual services and equipment exceed amounts estimated for budget purposes, the Director of Finance is hereby authorized to

increase appropriations, in the amount exceeding original estimates, upon Council's approval of said bid.

<u>Section 5</u>. This legislation involves appropriating money and is hereby passed as an emergency measure pursuant to Charter Section 4-7 as being necessary in order to provide for the continued protection of the public peace, health, safety and welfare and for the further reason that it is necessary to keep the city's financial records complete and accurate.

Section 6. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage.
