During our marathon planning session, we talked through opportunities, and set the foundation for citywide policy goals that I will bring to you for your approval in an upcoming study session. From there, I will



hand those to our department heads who will share our citywide 2022 goals throughout the ranks.

Budget Hearings: Council budget hearings begin on Monday, October 11 in the Justice Center Community Room at 4:00 p.m. and Monday, November 1 in the Justice Center Community Room at 4:00 p.m. The November 1 budget hearing will take place during Council's Study Session. We will then hold the regular meeting of City Council in Council Chambers at 7:00 p.m. Good news and in the spirit of budget season, overall City of Vandalia income tax collections are up YTD by 8.33% (\$1,063,283). Withholding tax is up YTD 7.28% (\$707,866), individual tax up YTD 6.77% (\$79,309), and business net profit up YTD 14.72% (\$276,108).

This award was delayed from last year due to the pandemic cancelling last year's award ceremony. The criteria for the Gold Ribbon Award is that "critical services were maintained during the event; citizens were provided a near-normal level of service during the event; and the communications center personnel mitigated the community effect of the disaster." PSS Haley Rue and PSS Deborah Wright were recognized during the awards ceremony and represented VPD for their outstanding service. I have attached the announcement.

Downtown: I have met face-to-face with Superintendent O'Leary to discuss economic development incentives to spur downtown development. This meeting was extremely positive and inspiring. Drone Shots: The Division of Fire has filed a flight plan to capture footage of various projects and developments such as the Helke Road project, Redwood Development and the White Castle expansion.

Façade Improvement Program: We have received and approved two applications for the Façade Improvement Program to date. The applications were for Ken Morris Insurance Agency who replaced windows, the front door, and changed out an iron handrail. Ken Morris Agency received \$2,840.48 in funding for this project. The second application was for the multi-tenant building that houses Jim's Donuts, All About Dance, and the Vandalia Barbershop. This project was awarded \$7,864 for the replacement of a deteriorating drop ceiling on the building's awning. We've had interest in the program from other parties and continue to work with them to submit applications. Collaborative Community-Police Advisory Board. Ohio police agencies are encouraged to maintain self-certification compliance on an annual basis.

SUBJECT: INFORMATION UPDATE – PERIOD ENDING OCTOBER 8, 2021

- September 28th crews were called to National Rd. near the Nissan dealership on electrical fire issues involving poles at the street. Traffic was temporarily detoured until the utility company made it on scene to help control the issue.
- 2. Crews, along with the public works department and a local towing company were called to the scene of a diesel fuel spill on September 29. Crews found a semi-truck who's saddle tank ruptured leaving 150+ gallons of diesel fuel in a parking lot along National Rd. The spill was contained, reported to the Ohio EPA and cleaned up by a private contractor.
- 3. The Fire Prevention Bureau investigators attended a Fire Investigation Team Annual Seminar on September 29. The seminar was held in Butler County and provided the bureau members with additional knowledge and experience to bring back to the Division of Fire.
- 4. The Division of Fire would like to recognize retired Chief Mark Whetstone on being named the Vandalia-Butler Chamber of Commerce "Business Professional of the Year" Congratulations to Chief Whetstone on a well-deserved recognition.
- 5. Career staff participated in 4 days of Rope Rescue Technician Training during this reporting period. This was the second phase of training that began earlier in the summer. Crews were able to use the Englewood Training Tower, The water tower at the Recreation Complex, and the Dayton Fire Training Center for multiple types of rope rescue training scenarios.

- 6. Fire Prevention Week is the first week of October. This year the Fire Prevention
 Bureau kicked off the week with a Safety message to Learn the Sounds of Fire
 Safety and the Division of Fire's annual Open House. The week will continue with
 other outreach programs and information to the community on fire safety.
- 7. After a year off due to Covid, The Division of Fire came back to host a successful Open House on October 3rd. The Division of Fire had door prizes, Kona Ice, a visit from Sparky, equipment demonstrations, and firetruck rides. Thank you to all who came out to visit and learn!
- 8. On Monday Oct 4th the Division of Fire held first round of interviews to fill a full-time career member vacancy that was left this summer. The Division of Fire hopes to review and move forward quickly to fill this position.
- 9. The Division of Fire has been actively recruiting part time employees to fill multiple vacancies. Over the last few weeks, we have been able to welcome 6 new members to the staff. Currently the new crew members are attending orientation and training and we look to see them shifted with their regular crew soon.

RECREATION/ATHLETICS DIVISION

The Vandalia Lions Club will no longer be offering their Annual Halloween Parade event. In an attempt to fill this void in the community Recreation Manager Aaron Messenger is planning a "Halloween Hangout" event on Thursday, October 28 from 5-7pm at the Sports Complex Baseball Concession Stand. This is a free community event in which kids are encouraged to wear costumes and participated in hayrides and arts & crafts. There will be a DJ and a food truck at the event as well. Local businesses and groups will be handing out candy and other small giveaways as well.

Jeff Kreill and I will be meeting with SwimSafe representatives later this week to discuss a possible extension of our aquatics staffing contract for 2022. The current two year agreement ends at the end of this year. We have shared our concerns and expectations for the operations at Cassel Hills Pool and plan to add some assurances into the agreement. We do not have many issues to resolve concerning the VRC Aquatics staffing.

<u>FACILITY MAINTENANCE DIVISION</u>

Building Maintenance staff is working with Energy Systems Group on a lighting audit walk through of the Justice Center, Fire Station I, Clubhouse, Senior Center and Park Garage as part of our Project Development Agreement for the Facilities Infrastructure Improvement project.

Custodial Supervisor Mark Collins and his evening custodial crew are working on hard surface floor care at the Justice Center.

Rudy Wells met with the contractor who will be planting the new median landscaping at W. National as well as N. Dixie Drive. Plans are for an install during the month of October or early November.

The limestone benches at the Art Park have been moved back in place onto the new asphalt pathways.

A total of five commemorative trees have been ordered for fall planting. Our new recognition program for commemorative trees is going very well. There seems to be quite the interest in placing either a in ground plaque at the base of the tree or the medallion charm on a branch in the tree.

RECREATION CENTER

Staff met with Ted Baker and Pete Baldauf to discuss the Recreation Center west entry. We are exploring the option of making the west entry door touchless and the parking lot area closest to the door handicapped accessible. Funds for this project would come from the American Rescue Plan Act funding.

The VRC offered a Kids Mental Health Awareness seminar on October 4. The session was presented by Premier Health's Christina Mortsolf, MS, LPCC who spoke about ways to help kids cope with their emotions in a healthy way and what to do when they need help and support. The event was for children and parents and was well attended.

The annual VRC Maintain Program will kick off in November and run through the holiday season. The goal of the program is for participants to set fitness goals and work towards improving or at the very least maintain their health during the holidays. Registration for this very popular program is currently underway.

The Recreation Center has established a partnership with the Vandalia-Butler Schools Multiple Disabilities program in which students come to the VRC and perform cleaning tasks and pick up trash around the Sports Complex and VRC grounds. During their latest visit the group cleaned lockers in all three locker rooms and cleaned the air return vents in the west hallway.

GOLF DIVISION

The awesome staff at Public Works completed the cart path paving project at the golf course this week. A fresh coat of asphalt was added to the cart paths on #14 & #15. We are extremely grateful to Public Works for their annual efforts in paving our cart paths at Cassel Hills.

The roofing project at the golf course has been completed. The Clubhouse along with the Cart Barn had a roof replacement and the Golf Maintenance Building had roof repairs completed as part of the project.

All golf leagues are now completed as well as all high school golf matches. The course hosted over 40 matches this season between Butler and Tipp school teams.

We continue to work on the golf course restroom building project. DES and I met with representatives of Vancon Construction to review their proposed plans for the building along with pricing. Vancon would be a design build process as opposed to the pre-fabricated style of structure that we have been considering. The pre-fab options have several obstacles including getting the building to the site without damage to the course. We hope to have a recommendation by early next week.

SENIOR CITIZENS CENTER

Thanks to the efforts of Pete Baldauf and Ted Baker we have learned the walls in the Senior Center that we would like to make sound proof are load bearing. Therefore, our plan to replace the current partitions with sound proof partitions is no longer a viable option. We have removed this project from the capital budget plan.

- 1. During the past two weeks, VPD officers made 17 traffic stops on commercial motor vehicles for traffic violations. These stops resulted in 15 written warnings and two verbal warnings while working 16 additional enforcement hours.
- 2. Detectives charged a Dayton male resident with domestic violence and felony disrupting public services after an altercation with his girlfriend, who is a Moraine resident, on Webster Street by Little York Road, where the suspect broke his girlfriend's cellphone while she was trying to call for help on September 24.
- 3. VPD received the final certification for achieving full compliance with the Ohio Collaborative Law Enforcement Agency Certification on Group 5 standards (LE Response to Mass Protests/Demonstrations, Agency Wellness Standard). The Ohio Collaborative was established five years ago, and all standards are developed by the Ohio Collaborative Community-Police Advisory Board. Ohio police agencies are encouraged to maintain self-certification compliance on an annual basis.
- 4. On the morning of September 27, VPD increased our patrol staffing in an anticipation of a possible highway shutdown by commercial drivers and motorists protesting a government vaccination mandate. In the weeks leading up to this date, VPD received intelligence bulletins and updates from the Ohio State Patrol and other local law enforcement agencies regarding this activity that was being broadcast on social media. By partnering with the Ohio State Patrol and Montgomery County Sheriff's Office, VPD had a high visible presence along the highway entrance and exit ramps and prepared to coordinate traffic control on Vandalia's roadways should a highway shutdown occur. Fortunately, the high visible police presence discouraged this activity from occurring and prevented a significant impact on our businesses and school district.
- 5. I attended the Vandalia-Butler Chamber of Commerce Awards Ceremony on September 28 at Scene 75 Banquet Center. The ceremony was well attended by community leaders and business partners and had many great nominees for the various categories. We wish to congratulate Councilwoman Farst for being selected as the recipient for the 2020 Distinguished Service Award.
- 6. On September 28, VPD officers responded to a house on Cliffbrook Court for suspicious noises at the rear of the house heard by the resident who was home.

Officers responded and found an attempt burglary where the back door was damaged from being kicked in. Witnesses described two potential suspects and officers located the suspects nearby. Officers detained, identified and arrested both suspects for attempt burglary. Detectives are awaiting lab results for filing felony charges. Additionally, a firearm was located in the vicinity of where the suspects were detained and is being analyzed by the Crime Lab to determine if it is connected to this offense.

- 7. The Vandalia-Butler Chamber of Commerce organized a job fair at the Student Activity Center on September 30. Sergeant Chiles and Lieutenant Sucher attended on behalf of VPD to speak with Vandalia-Butler High School juniors and seniors. High School staff worked with students prior to the event to prepare them for conduct during interviews with potential employers. Approximately 500 high school students attended the job fair with many showing interest in career opportunities VPD and the City of Vandalia has to offer.
- 8. - 11. I attended the Council retreat on Wednesday evening and enjoyed the interaction with council members and other department directors. It is exciting to see and experience positive momentum among staff and Council as the City progresses with development and positive changes.

Development & Engineering Services

The Helke Road Watermain and Road Reconstruction is moving along very well. They will have all of the watermain work completed on Monday. Tuesday, they plan to start excavating for the roadway and installing the gravel base. They will also begin prepping for the concrete work.

Barret Paving has completed all of the resurfacing work except N. Dixie Drive. The median was installed on Dixie Drive this week and they will be back next week to install the asphalt on Dixie.

Our application was submitted to MVRPC this week for The FAST Act Funds for the Webster Street Resurfacing Project. The total estimated project cost including engineering is \$979,414. We are requesting \$717,131.20 in Federal dollars making our local share \$262,282.80. Applications will be reviewed by MVRPC and announcements will be made on selected projects in March. The project is scheduled for construction in 2024.

Chad Baughman is in the process of finalizing our Gabriel Street Reconstruction plans and we anticipate soliciting bids in the next couple weeks. This item is scheduled to be on Council's agenda for award on November 15th.

A contractor performed a property clean-up of brush and debris at 841 Spartan Avenue.

You, Amber and I along with representatives from the Montgomery County Engineer's office met with Frank DeBrosse from Representative Mike Turner's office to discuss possible funding options and ways to potentially expedite the NE Logistics Roadway project that would improve Lightner Road, N. Drive and Northwoods Boulevard. Montgomery County Engineer's office has indicated that they will be advertising a Request For Qualifications for Engineering of this project in November. The project has been submitted to ODOT and has been given a Project ID number. We are in the process of scheduling a scope meeting with ODOT in the next couple of weeks.

Ted Baker, Pete Baldauf and Chris Mastrino attended the Ribbon Cutting at Heraeus on October 7th.

Public Works

Crews have performed a lot of asphalt work during this period. We excavated several areas and installed base asphalt where our contractor had milled and the gravel was exposed. We also installed approximately 270 tons of asphalt at Cassel Hills golf course repaying the cart paths.


We performed one burial at Poplar Hill Cemetery this period. We also paved both driveway entrances to the cemetery.

On May 27, 2019 the Miami Valley had 15 tornadoes impact the area. This included an EF-4 the struck immediately adjacent jurisdictions and an EF-2 that struck the southern part of the Vandalia Division of Police and Fire's jurisdiction. Between 2200 and 0200 (on May 28), the Vandalia Division of Police Communication Center handled close to 200 phone calls (incoming and outgoing). This was a 2000% increase over normal operations. Many of those calls were roll-overs from neighboring communication centers. There were also 539 different radio transmission recorded during the same time frame; a 770% increase over normal operations. This was due to fire apparatus responding mutual aid to assist neighboring jurisdictions and within their jurisdiction. The three Public Safety Specialists on duty displayed enormous teamwork, professionalism, and reassurance to citizens within our jurisdiction and neighboring jurisdictions. All three of them lived in communities that were impacted by the tornadoes and performed while not knowing the status of their own families and houses. As a single agency police and fire PSAP, this stretched the limits of our center; however due to their efforts our citizens continued to receive an exemplary level of service.
