Honorable Mayor Herbst & Esteemed City Councilmembers:

Thank you for the opportunity to update you on our progress toward achieving the goals outlined in the Vision Vandalia Comprehensive Plan! This week, we made great investments in our future by transferring \$1,000,000 to the Facilities Improvement / Maintenance Reserve Fund (360) for seed money for a future Public Works Facility. We also put aside the proceeds (\$563,375) from the sale of the old fire station to save for a potential joint fire training facility with Butler Township and our neighboring departments. In both cases, I am working with entities to negotiate separate land donations that will be used to serve our community. I will update you as more details arise.

Finance Director Leiter, ACM Holloway, Assistant Finance Director Carnes, and I have conducted our initial review of the preliminary 2022 operating, maintenance, and capital budget. I have begun to conduct budget hearings with department leadership and I look forward to discussing policy priorities at our upcoming retreat. I will release an agenda and exhibits for your review next week. Formal budget workshops for City Council will be held at 4:00 pm on October 11

and November 1. Budget workshop agendas and details are forthcoming.

It was a great week for camaraderie and tacos! HR Manager Dewberry, Assistant Sherri Howard, Communications Manager Hopkins, and Senior Center Coordinator Toni Williams put considerable work into ensuring that our employee appreciation taco bar was a great success! There was a lot of





laughing, good morale, and I made sure to eat one taco for every employee who could not attend.

It was a whirlwind of a week. I met with Senator Niraj Antani to discuss commercial truck traffic and ODOT potentially funding the City's safety initiatives on National Rd. I also presented the City's nascent proposals for obtaining funding through the Ohio Capital Budget Bill for a stage and many other amenities at Art Park. I attended represented the City at the Miami Valley Risk Management Association Board Meeting, Tri-Cities North Regional Wastewater Authority Board Meeting, and Northern Area Water Authority Meeting... It was a big week for risk management and utilities to say the least. In addition, Director Clark, Superintendent Kreill, and I met with Swim Safe to discuss negotiation parameters and the necessary conditions for continuing the relationship next year. Finally, in a herculean feat and despite obstacle-laden terrain, ACM Holloway and 143 Engineers have submitted our application for safety study funds to improve the National Rd. corridor from Dixie Dr. to Ranchview. This project will be transformative in terms of mitigating commercial truck traffic through town, improving the visibility of our businesses, and making our town friendlier to cyclists and pedestrians – unequivocal goals of the comprehensive plan.

- 1. **Chamber Honor Awards:** Congratulations to Councilmember Candice Farst, Councilmember Connie Woods and Assistant City Manager Holloway all of whom have been nominated for awards this year! The event will take place at the Scene75 Banquet Hall, Tuesday, Sept 28 5:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m.
- 2. Parks & Recreation Master Plan: Director Clark and I have reviewed a Request for Qualifications for the 2022 Parks & Recreation Master Plan. This guiding document will be used to help the City achieve escalating quality-of-life, prioritize capital and programming needs, act as a necessary supplement to the 2020 Vision Vandalia Comprehensive Plan, and assist the Parks & Recreation Department with becoming a CAPRA Accredited department in the coming years. The RFQ will be posted on Monday. Director Clark, Recreation Superintendent Kreill, City Planner Karto, and I will review the proposals and recommend a qualified professional firm to lead the planning process.
- 3. **Downtown Development:** This week, I met with Mr. Ben Neely and we formed the start of the Downtown Blue-Ribbon Committee. As I mentioned during our briefing last week, in the coming months, I will ask Council to consider a variety of economic development tools to catalyze development. I look forward to discussing this in-depth at our retreat.
- 4. **Welcome Erin Crisp!** Finance Assistant Erin Crisp joined our team of public servants on Monday. Mrs. Crisp formerly worked in a court and is learning the ropes from Mrs. Kim Bruce!
- 5. **Small Business Relief Grant:** Please continue to direct our local business people to take advantage of the small business relief grant. The application is available on the website: https://www.vandaliaohio.org/smallbizrelief. To ensure that our business partners receive



- accurate information about the program restrictions, entrepreneurs and proprietors should be directed to contact ACM Holloway.
- 6. **Leaf Pickup:** I have enclosed the leaf pickup map. Collection will start on October 7 and will conclude on December 7.
- 7. **Recruitment Administrative Assistant Department of Finance:** The City is recruiting an Administrative Assistant who will report directly to Finance Director Leiter. This is a confidential secretary position, which is unclassified under the Vandalia Charter. In addition to fulfilling a variety complex administrative tasks that serve all of our departments, this person will be the *face of the City* at the Municipal Building. - 8. **Asphalt Overlay and Resurfacing:** Please see the attached map of areas that are included in the project. Barret Paving began milling this week and will begin paving next week. They have sawcut the pavement and plant to begin excavating for the installation of the median on N. Dixie Drive on Monday as well.
- 9. Helke Rd.: The Helke Road Watermain and Road Reconstruction is underway. All of the residential services were disconnected from the old 6" watermain and reconnected to the 16" main. The contractor is now working on disconnecting the cross-street mains from the old 6" watermain so that it can be abandoned and taken out of service. Even with the wet weather Brumbaugh Construction has made significant progress on the project. Helke Road will remain closed from Pool Avenue to National Road until work begins in the Pool Avenue intersection. At that time the closure will extend to the south and the detour route will be altered.
- 10. Jeans on Friday in October Breast Cancer Awareness: Each October, the Division of Fire sells t-shirts and donates the proceeds to support breast cancer awareness. Proceeds will be donated to the Pink Ribbon Girls. Any non-uniform employee who purchases a shirt for this fundraiser will be allowed to wear jeans on each of the five Fridays in October. Alternatively, non-uniform employees may provide a donation of \$18 at the Utility Billing window in the Finance Department and wear jeans on Fridays in October as well. - 11. **FREE Employee Flu Shots**: Flu shots will be administered by Hock's Pharmacy on Thursday, October 14, 2021 from 7am-9am in the LCR at the Municipal Building. Employees are instructed to bring their insurance card. A reminder email will be sent out next week with more details and an attached medical questionnaire to complete.
- 12. Commercial Truck Traffic: The Montgomery County Engineers Office and the City of Vandalia have been awarded \$1.6 mm in ODOT TRAC funding for the preliminary design and engineering for improvements around the north and east side of the airport. The scope of this project covers Lightner Rd. North Dixie Northwoods Boulevard. The purpose of this project is to divert commercial vehicles around the airport to I-75 rather than through town.




The list of project awards is enclosed. The City has received considerable help and support from Mr. Steve Stanley and the Montgomery County Transportation Improvement District throughout this initiative. This project could total more than \$20 mm and is estimated to be completed in 2027. Mr. Dittoe of High Bridge Consulting is in the process of setting up a meeting with Congressman Turner's office to discuss the possibilities of a congressional earmark to accelerate the project's completion date. Mayor Herbst and I will meet with the Congressman's office as early as this coming Thursday and I am waiting for final confirmation. This is a great opportunity to collaborate with our neighbors and I have received verbal support and interest from several stakeholders.

During the past two weeks, VPD officers made 10 traffic stops on commercial motor vehicles for traffic violations. These stops resulted in 2 traffic citations and 8 written warnings to include one stop resulting in 10 additional Ohio State Patrol violations while working 16 additional enforcement hours. During this special duty, Office Wehner detected one semi-truck with several safety issues that required it being taken out of service and towed.

On September 14, five officers from VPD and four officers from outside agencies, attended a Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Training hosted at the Justice Center. This training was put on by the OSP Motor Carrier Unit. This training will be held again in the future to honor the commitment of the enforcement of commercial motor vehicle laws in Vandalia. All VPD Police Officers who are assigned to patrol will be trained in commercial vehicle enforcement by the end of 2022.

having an open burn.

Our annual Touch-a-Truck event took place on September 18 at the Sports Complex and was once again very successful thanks to the efforts of Recreation Manager Aaron Messenger. More than 200 people attended the event and I only lost my 1 year old for about 2 minutes when he fell behind the seat of Public Works dump truck. Maybe he will be a

- fourth-generation public servant! Police, Fire, Public Works and Parks Divisions provided vehicles, equipment and personnel for the event.
- 15. **Fall Festival:** The Annual Fall Festival will be held on Saturday, October 9 from 3:00-6:00 pm at the Art Park. The event will include live music, food trucks, vendors, inflatables, arts & crafts, s'mores, and a pumpkin patch.
- 16. VRC Membership Special: The VRC is offering a Fall membership special that includes the final months of 2021 for free. Sign up for a 2022 membership before November 1 and get the rest of 2021 included in the membership. The fall months have historically been our slowest membership months so we are looking to get people active before the end of the year membership rush. Collectively, I have challenged the department to make progress toward regaining membership that was lost during the pandemic.
- 17. **Blight Abatement:** The demolition and removal of the damaged garage at 4359 Little York Road has been completed. This structure was damaged by a fallen tree back in 2017 and the abatement was conducted with via a lawful court order. With great persistence of Chief
 - Building Official Ted Baker, direction from Law Director McDonald, and considerable assistance from the Vandalia Division of Police; this project has been successfully completed and the unsafe structure has been removed. It is worth noting that the contractor and City staff were very respectful throughout the process. It is quite uncomfortable for the City to disturb a resident's private property and every alternate avenue was pursued prior to demolition of the collapsed structure.



Ultimately, intervention by the City was necessary. The expense will be billed to the owner and if not paid, assessed on the property taxes. When I arrived, Chief Building Official Baker told me that this was on his list of things to accomplish before his retirement. Well, *Mission Accomplished*.

- 18. **Job Fair:** The Vandalia Butler Chamber of Commerce will be hosting a Job Fair at Butler High School on September 30 from 9:00am to 2:00pm in the Student Activity Center. VPRD staff will be on hand to promote our department's part time and seasonal positions. Due to staffing issues we have been facing during 2021, we are excited to be a part of this event and hopeful to come away with some great candidates for our many positions of need including custodial, golf and park maintenance, youth sport officials as well VRC positions.
- 19. **Vandalia Arts Council:** The VAC has issued a *Call to Artists* for a permanent sculpture in Art Park. The announcement is enclosed.
- 20. **Crossroads Motel Mowing:** Our contractor has completed another clean-up of the vacant property at 845 E. National Road. The entire property was mowed, all weeds were cut and



areas were sprayed around the old building foundation and paved areas.

21. Fire Station Open House: The Division of Fire is currently planning on holding our annual Open House event again this year. After not having an event last year, we are excited to invite the community back for this event. The Open House will also kick off Fire Prevention week and will be held Sunday October 3rd 12:00pm to 2:00pm.

A Request for Qualifications (RFQ) has been issued for the selection of a consultant to provide professional services to prepare a Parks and Recreation Master Plan. Interested consultants must submit their proposal and qualifications by October 15. A selection committee will review submittals and selected firms to advance to the interview/presentation portion of the process. It is our goal to have a firm selected to begin the Master Planning process by the end of the year.

FACILITY MAINTENANCE DIVISION

The fuel tank installation project at the Park Maintenance Garage has been delayed as the contractor awaits several parts that have not arrived as of yet. The install will be rescheduled once the parts arrive and the tank is emptied of fuel as it was necessary to purchase fuel due to the delay.

The Tipp City Mum Festival will once again be renting our mobile sound stage for their event this weekend, September 24-26. Staff will be transporting the stage to Tipp on Friday morning for set up and usage over the weekend.

Rudy conducted a mandatory site inspection at the Justice Center for interested asphalt contractors. Four contractors attended with three providing proposals for the necessary repairs. Rudy is reviewing the proposals and will make a project award recommendation in the coming days.

Maintenance staff completed weed control spraying in landscape beds and applied a pre-emergent herbicide at various locations for fall weed control. Tree sucker growth removal was also completed at the Sports Complex.

Energy Systems Group emerged from our Facilities Infrastructure Improvement Project selection process as the top firm. We are recommending entering into a Project Development agreement with ESG to begin the engineering portion of scope development.

RECREATION/ATHLETICS DIVISION

Our annual Touch-a-Truck event took place on September 18 at the Sports Complex and was once again very successful thanks to the efforts of Recreation Manager Aaron Messenger. An estimated attendance of over 200 people came to the event. We appreciate the support of the Police, Fire, Public Works and Parks Divisions for providing vehicles, equipment and personnel for the event.

Recreation Superintendent Jeff Kreill is researching the possible placement of AED's in parks. He has communicated with the communities of Upper Arlington and Neptune NJ as well as the Centerville Washington Township Park District about their experiences with outdoor AED's in parks. He also met with Chief Follick to discuss the idea and get supplier information. All feedback has been positive thus far so he will continue his research along with identifying possible partners for the purchase of AED devices.

The Annual Fall Festival will be held on Saturday, October 9 from 3:00-6:00 pm at the Art Park. The event will include live music, food trucks, vendors, inflatables, arts & crafts, s'mores, and a pumpkin patch. Recreation Manager Aaron Messenger is putting the final touches on the event which has always been very popular and draws a very nice crowd.

Our field use agreement with Butler United Soccer Club was scheduled to end at the conclusion of the fall soccer season. John Myers and Jeff Kreill have been meeting with Club representative to renew the agreement and will be updating the documents to continue the partnership.

VPRD staff will be on hand to promote our department's part time and seasonal positions. GOLF DIVISION

Cassel Hills Golf Course once again hosted the Chuck Upthegrove 36 hole classic on September 13. This event brought in over \$7,000 of revenue to the course. Belmont Catering hosted the dinner while we provided a continental breakfast and bag lunches for the players.

Two large Cottonwood trees next to the tee box on #7 were removed as their roots had grown into the water lines for the irrigation system.

The City's Annual Business Appreciation Day Golf Outing was held on September 14 with 44 players participating in the event. The weather was great and golfers seemed to have a great time.

Golf leagues and high school golf matches are coming to a close over the next couple of weeks. It has been a good year for our leagues as well as the Butler and Tipp golf programs at CHGC.

SENIOR CITIZENS CENTER

Toni and Jeff visited the Beavercreek Senior Center to look at their sound proof room partitions that open and close. They subsequently met with Ted Baker and Pete Baldauf to examine whether the walls we are considering installing the partitions is load bearing. Ted and Pete are reviewing the building blue prints to make a determination.

Building Maintenance staff installed a new ice machine in the kitchen area of the Senior Center. The project involved modifying some cabinets and counter tops in order to provide an improved work space.

Van Tran had a total of 185 one-way rides for the month of August bring the yearly total to 942 for 2021. The program continues to grow thanks to the efforts of Toni Williams and the volunteer drivers.

- During the past two weeks, VPD officers made 10 traffic stops on commercial motor vehicles for traffic violations. These stops resulted in 2 traffic citations and 8 written warnings to include one stop resulting in 10 additional Ohio State Patrol violations while working 16 additional enforcement hours.
- 2. Lt. Walker attended the City's EOP and tabletop exercise on Monday, September 13. The topics covered included each department's responsibilities in the EOP and suggested pre-planning strategies. The police department's responsibilities would primarily be scene security and providing support to other emergency services.
- 3. Detectives charged a 29-year-old Vandalia man with four counts unlawful sexual contact with a minor for having sex with a 13-year-old Dayton resident in his mother's apartment.
- 4. CPO Wehner hosted the September 15th Citizen's Police Academy at VPD with Butler Twp. officers. Anissa Kanzari covered dispatching and communications center responsibilities. Andy taught the Run, Hide, Fight program. Det. Hulbert joined the session to talk about crime scenes and evidence processing. VPD gave each student in the class a new coffee mug and instructed them how to process and lift fingerprints from the mug. Lt. Walker and Detectives Fraley and Hulbert hosted the September 22nd Citizen's Police Academy at VPD. The topics covered included use of force and the MILO training simulator. Attendees participated in several scenarios.
- 5. Vandalia detectives, Lt Walker, and CPO Wehner were present at each school in the City to observe a scheduled lock-down drill. This drill was particularly challenging as the lock-down drill was initiated directly following a fire drill. The drills were successful with no major deficiencies noted.
- 6. Detectives charged a 44-year-old Dayton female with one count of criminal damaging and one count of criminal trespassing. These charges stem from an investigation where a Kenbrook Drive resident came home and found the suspect damaging a window screen, possibly attempting to break into the apartment.

- 7. Detectives charged a 47-year old Dayton man with one count of Unauthorized use of a Motor Vehicle. This charge stems from the suspect borrowing a vehicle from a Columbus, Ohio woman at the Hawthorn Suites and refusing to return the vehicle.
- 8. On September 16, Lieutenants Sucher and Walker, Support Services Manager Kanzari, and I attended a one-day presentation at Great Oaks Training Academy in Sharonville on Risk Management for Public Safety Executives taught by Gordon Graham. The instruction was valuable and enlightening surrounding current risks within public safety.
- 9. On September 14, five officers from VPD and four officers from outside agencies, attended a Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Training hosted at the Justice Center. This training was put on by the OSP Motor Carrier Unit. This training will be held again in the future to honor the commitment of the enforcement of commercial motor vehicle laws in Vandalia.
- 10. I attended a virtual meeting for the Montgomery County Re-Entry Program education subcommittee on September 20.
- 11. I attended the *Meet at the Flagpole* gathering at Morton Middle School with a variety of community faith leaders on Wednesday morning to provide prayer for our students, parents and school teachers and officials.
- 12. Lieutenant Sucher, Lieutenant Walker and I attended the Montgomery County Association of Police Chiefs monthly meeting on Thursday at Sinclair Community College. Guest speakers provided information on the Attorney General's OH-LEG resource website and the Montgomery County Prisoner Re-Entry Program.
- 13. Several VPD employees attended the Employee Taco Bar lunch on Thursday at the Senior Citizen Center. We thank the City for hosting these employee appreciation lunches and special activities for employees to interact with staff from other city departments.
- 14. With the assistance of the West Chester Police Department, Detectives were able to successfully charge a 48-year-old male from Fairborn, Ohio with Felony-4 Receiving Stolen Property. This male is possibly responsible for stealing an employee's vehicle at Beau Townsend Ford and driving it to a Meijer in West Chester, Ohio.
- 15. The Homecoming parade was held Thursday, September 23. Lt. Walker worked with school officials and public works to organize the parade route and traffic control. Vandalia officers provided traffic coverage during the parade. The parade route changed this year due to the construction around Tuskegee Airman Way. The route began at Helke & National Roads from the old ATA grounds. Road closures were communicated through physical signs being posted, social media posts and Hyper-Reach messages to the community.
- 16. PSS Grace Conley began her employment on September 15 and was introduced to council at their meeting on Monday, September 20. Grace's family was in attendance and then received a tour of the police department.

<u>Development & Engineering Services</u>

The Helke Road Watermain and Road Reconstruction is underway. They have all of the residential services disconnected from the old 6" watermain and reconnected to the 16" main. They are now working on disconnecting the cross-street mains from the old 6" watermain so that it can be abandoned and taken out of service. Even with the wet weather Brumbaugh Construction has made significant progress on the project. Helke Road will remain closed from Pool Avenue to National Road until work begins in the Pool Avenue intersection. At that time the closure will extend to the south and the detour route will be altered.

Barret Paving began milling this week and will begin paving next week. They have sawcut the pavement and plant to begin excavating for the installation of the median on N. Dixie Drive on Monday as well.

MVRPC will be accepting applications for FAST Act projects for new transportation projects using CRRSAA/STP/TA Funds. This year they will be accepting STP applications for resurfacing projects as well as other roadway projects. Resurfacing projects not offered every year and are only eligible for funding in State Fiscal Year 2023 and 2024. We will be submitting an application for resurfacing funds. Applications are due October 7th. A resolution authorizing the application will be required.

The demolition and removal of the damaged garage at 4359 Little York Road has been completed. This structure was damaged by a fallen tree back in 2017. With great persistence of Ted Baker and assistance from Law Director Jerry McDonald we are all glad to see this completed. Also thank you to the Police Department for their assistance as well.

Our contractor has completed another clean-up of the vacant property at 845 E. National Road. The entire property was mowed, all weeds were cut and areas were sprayed around the old building foundation and paved areas.

Ted Baker and I participated in the Business Appreciation Day Golf Outing hosted by the City. This is a great event to network and socialize with our local business people. Kudos to the staff at Cassell Hills for the course being in tip-top shape and ordering the prefect weather for the day.

Public Works

We held our monthly large item drop off at our facility on September 11th. Next month will be our last one of this year and we will resume again next March.

Our crews set up the detour route signage for the Helke Road project. We also assisted with traffic control for and advanced warning signs for the Vandalia Butler Homecoming Parade.

We performed one burial at Poplar Hill Cemetery this period. We also paved the south drive entrance to the cemetery and prepped the north entrance to pave next week.


We put up banners on National Road for the Oktoberfest. We also switched to the Fall banners and put up the Vandalia Aviator banners for Homecoming.


We repaired a 6" water valve on N. Brown School Road. We have also continued the EPA mandated water valve exercising program. We should have our required 20% this year completed during this period.



Budget: \$10,000

Budget Description:

The budget for this project is ¬¬\$ 10,000. The selected artist or artist team will be responsible for the design, fabrication, shipment to the site, and must work with City staff on installation. The available budget must cover all artists' expenses including, artist fees, taxes, insurance, materials, tools, travel, expense contingency, and other associated costs. Permit fees will be paid by the City. Final installation will be paid for by VAC. VAC will also pay for liability coverage for work expected to be performed on City property, if necessary.

Sculpture Location: Vandalia Art Park, 256 E. Alkaline Springs Road, Vandalia, Ohio About Vandalia Art Park – 256 E. Alkaline Springs Rd., Vandalia, Ohio - The Vandalia Art Park serves as an 8-acre walkable art exhibit and adds to the many amenities within the City of Vandalia. This park is joined to the Vandalia-Butler Historical Society grounds by the new Vandalia Rotary Bridge. This regional destination is free to the public and combines art and history. Other activities and art initiatives complement the park and add to the appreciation of the exhibits on display throughout the year. The leased sculptures join "At Play in Geologic Time" by Matthew Weir, a permanent limestone piece created during Vandalia's "Chiseled" 2010 Sculpture Symposium, Daddy Long Legs by metal artist Dave Vande Vusse and purchased by PAIV and VCAP in 2015, "Bladerunner" created during Vandalia's Heavy Metal Remix by Doug Benedict in September of 2016, as well as the park's entryway Bottlecap Totem crafted by com-



munity members in 2020 which replaced the original mosaic totems created by local artists in 2015. Artist Todd Frahm, Asheville, North Carolina (Bellwether Sculptor from Chiseled 2010) has carved 6 limestone benches which are permanent additions to the park. Two benches were part of a mini-symposium sponsored by VCAP, PAIV and the Ohio Arts Council in 2017. Four individually commissioned benches were added in 2018. In addition to the exhibits, the Vandalia-Butler Foundation partnered with Vandalia Arts Council and the City of Vandalia to sponsor the musical instruments for our residents' outdoor enjoyment. In 2019, Phases I and II of the Vandalia Rotary Amphitheater were constructed.

Project Goals:

The Vandalia Arts Council desires to add to the permanent sculptures at the Vandalia Art Park. The committee also wishes to increase the interaction of the community with the park, therefore, the sculpture should have kinetic and acoustical elements. A primary goal of this project is to have a component of the sculpture that involves the community in the fabrication of the sculpture.

The artist will be expected to participate in two (2) community events lasting a maximum of four hours each or a total of 8 hours. The artist also will provide a brief discussion of their project at the closing ceremony.



Artwork Design, Safety and Durability Requirements:

The artwork must be fabricated in a durable, permanent, outdoor media that is safe, easily maintained, and has proven its viability in public installations. The artwork must be able to withstand harsh weather conditions and high winds.

The artwork must be constructed to reasonably discourage or deter theft and vandalism. The artwork must be suitable for public viewing by all ages.



The piece should be three-dimensional, durable, easily maintained and free standing. The art piece must be fabricated with a base that has the ability to be bolted or attached to a concrete surface or suitably designed footing. The sculpture must be able to be adhered to temporary cement tile(s) with the ability to be relocated to a permanent site later. The artist will be available to assist with the installation.
