2024 Budget Workshops – The third 2024 operating, maintenance, capital, and revitalization budget workshop was held at the Justice Center in the Community Room at 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 27, 2023. Thank you for the constructive discussion, active contributions to shaping the budget, and dialogue. The 2024 budget is scheduled to be before the City Council for consideration at the October 2, 2023, Study Session for discussion; October 16, 2023, Council Meeting for a first reading; and November 6, 2023 Council Meeting for a second reading and adoption.

Solar Charging Stations and the Sports Complex Playground! Parks Maintenance Technician Bryan Fine sent me this vibrant image earlier this week. Our team has installed solar powered charging stations (for phones, etc.) at the Sports Complex and Art Park! The chargers were paid for through the American Rescue Plan Act funds (ARPA). The new playground at the Sports Complex is looking great in purple and gold Aviator colors. The *forever lawn* safety surface has since been installed and Director Clark reports that the new playground (weather permitting) will likely be open by the end of the coming week. 

Action Item: Ohio Department of Liquor Control Permit Application – 670 W. National Road – Ohio Department of Liquor Control has notified the City of Vandalia of an application to Family Dollar Stores of Ohio LLC, DBA Family Dollar Store 26197 located at 670 W. National Road. The Division of Police has no objection to the new license and a hearing is not recommended. I would respectfully request a simple motion to not hold a hearing for the application at 670 W. National Rd.

Resolution: Emergency Replacement of Municipal Building Storm and Sanitary Pumping System - The Parks and Recreation Department is requesting to waive the formal bidding process to proceed with emergency replacement and installation of new sanitary and storm water pumping systems at the Municipal Building due to the failure of the current system and the urgency to replace the system. Heeter Plumbing provided a proposal for \$34,441. Parks & Recreation states that this is a competitive price, that this is an emergency action, and that there is some urgency to conduct the repairs. The current system is original to the building with the pumps receiving several repairs during the past 25 years. The scope of work will include the removal and proper disposal of the current pumping system and the installation of a new system, including control panel.

Monday, October 16, 2023, Items:

Resolution: 2024 Council Summer Schedule - This is a resolution to set the summer schedule of City Council meetings during the months of June, July, and August 2024. The proposal is that the City Council meet once per month, on the 3rd Monday of each month. The City Council Study Session would begin tentatively at 6:00 pm with the regular business meeting commencing at 7:00 pm. The official dates for 2024 would be June 17, July 15, and August 19. In previous years, after providing adequate notice, the City Council has held special meetings on the first Monday to consider planning and zoning items to be efficient and expeditious in the processing of lawful applications. If it is the desire or the City Council, I would recommend maintaining this same practice in 2024.

Resolution: Sanitary Sewer Slip Lining Bids - Bids were opened publicly for the Sanitary Sewer Slip Lining project on Tuesday September 26, 2023. Five sets of specifications were issued, and three contractors submitted bids for the project. Bids ranged from \$97,982.00 to \$125,454.00. Our estimate for the project was \$100,000. This project is being funded in part by a \$50,000 Community Development Block Grant that was secured by Public Service Director Cron. The City's portion of the project will be paid for out of sewer revenues and this expense is accounted for in the budget. Therefore, I recommend awarding the contract for this project to Insight Pipe Contracting as the lowest and best bid at their bid price of \$97,982.

Resolution: Accepting the Amounts and Rates as Determined by the Budget Commission and Authorizing the Necessary Tax Levies and Certifying them to the County Auditor – This resolution will accept the Amounts and Rates for Tax Year 2022. The Montgomery County Auditor noted the Amounts and Rates are subject to change due to election results and value changes. The revenue estimates continue to be at 95% collection. The packet includes a memo detailing the Local Government Fund distribution estimates for Calendar Year 2024, provided by the Montgomery County Auditor.

Ordinance: City-Initiated Rezoning to PF and OIP – This City-initiated rezoning involves nineteen parcels totaling 126.812 acres +/-, located at the following locations: 810 Northwoods Blvd., 815 Foley Dr., Webster Street approximately 500 feet south of Park Center Blvd., the intersection of Old Springfield and Old Canal Roads, and the southeast end of Johnson Station Rd. As proposed, the subject properties would be rezoned from Agriculture (A), Residential Single-Family 3 (RSF-3), Gateway Business (GB), Highway Business (HB), Office/Industrial Park (O/IP), and Industrial (I) to the Public Facilities (PF) and Office Industrial Park (O/IP) Zoning Districts. On September 26, the Planning Commission voted 5-0 to recommend approval of the proposed rezoning.

Ordinance: 2024 Budget - This ordinance authorizes appropriations for FY 2024.

Resolutions

Resolution 23-R-62: 2024 Part-Time Pay Plan: Staff is recommending adoption of the part-time pay plan, which includes rate increases of 3.5% to all part-time positions for the 2024 year except the tipped employee positions. This proposal also includes advancing the classifications of Group Fitness Instructor, Camp Supervisor, Athletic Supervisor, and Camp Leader to the next pay group based on a wage study that was conducted by the Department of Parks & Recreation. These changes were presented at the September 11, 2023, Fall City Council Retreat. The increases are necessary to retain current employees and to attract new employees. Expenses relating to this increase are included in the 2024 proposed budget. The wage for tipped employees will be established in accordance with the State of Ohio Department of Commerce. Approval of this new Part-Time Pay plan aligns with our 2023 Citywide Policy Goals of *Trust and Confidence* and *Opportunity*.

Resolution 23-R-63: 2024 General Services Pay Plan: Staff recommends a 3.5% increase to the pay ranges in the General Services Pay Plan for 2024. This increase is necessary to attract and to retain high-performing, quality employees. This proposal includes re-implementing the supervisory appointment of the Parks Maintenance Technician Supervisor classification to provide a formal first-line supervisor on the park maintenance crews and facilities maintenance crews. All employees on these crews work under the classification of Parks Maintenance Technician. This change was presented at the September 11, 2023, Fall City Council Retreat. Expenses relating to this increase are included in the 2024 proposed budget. Approval of the 2024 General Services Pay plan aligns with our 2023 Citywide Policy Goals of *Trust and Confidence* and *Opportunity*.

Resolution 23-R-64: Emergency Replacement of Municipal Building Storm and Sanitary Pumping System - The Parks and Recreation Department is requesting to waive the formal bidding process to proceed with emergency replacement and installation of new sanitary and storm water pumping systems at the Municipal Building due to the failure of the current system and the urgency to replace the system. Heeter Plumbing provided a proposal for \$34,441. Parks & Recreation states that this is a competitive price, that this is an emergency action, and that there is some urgency to conduct the repairs. The current system is original to the building with the pumps receiving several repairs during the past 25 years. The scope of work will include the removal and proper disposal of the current pumping system and the installation of a new system, including a control panel.

<u>Ordinance – First Reading:</u>

Ordinance 23-24 Fire Insurance: City Manager Wendt requested that Law Director McDonald draft this ordinance to empower the City of Vandalia to obtain a portion of fire insurance proceeds when there is a major loss. This type of ordinance is commonly used in other communities to help ensure that insurance proceeds are used to abate blight resulting from a structure fire, to protect public safety, and to help prevent the need to appropriate tax dollars to abate such blight. If adopted, the City of Vandalia would be able to hold a portion of fire insurance proceeds in a fund to ensure that proceeds are used to tear down the building (or repair it) – whether by the owner or by the City. Law Director McDonald has submitted a revised provision as there were phrases that were omitted when presented at the last Study Session. These changes do not affect the substance of the Ordinance and it is recommended that this ordinance be approved by the City Council in the First reading. It is worth noting that this ordinance will not be enforceable at the Super 8 Motel, which recently had a structure fire. The ordinance will apply to all properties that are damaged by a fire after the ordinance takes effect.

The next Council meeting is on **Monday, October 2, 2023, at 7:00 pm**. The meeting will be an in-person meeting in Council Chambers. The meeting is open to Council, staff, and the public to attend in-person. The meetings will be accessible for viewing on through Zoom. Please note, no comments, electronic or oral, will be allowed by people that are participating electronically through Zoom. Anyone wishing to be heard on a topic will need to appear personally at the meeting. **The Study Session will begin at 6:15 pm followed by the City Council Meeting at 7:00 pm.**

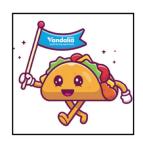


